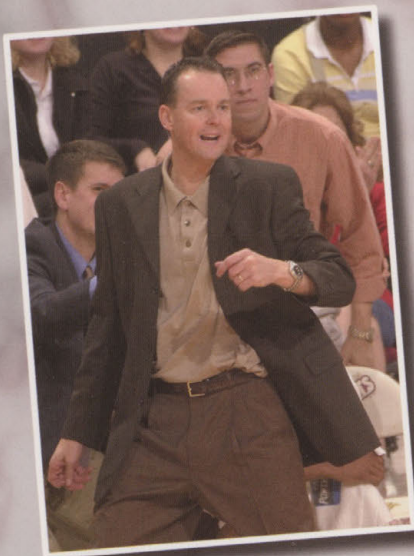

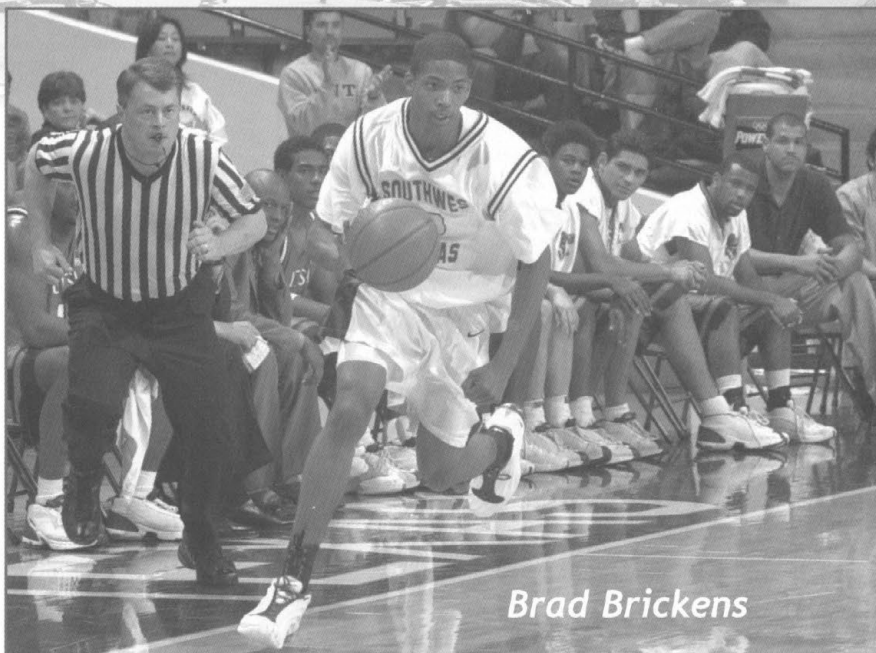

RADIO COVERAGE FOR 2002-03

Southwest Texas basketball will be heard on KTSW, 89.9-FM, the University's campus radio station, which is under the supervision of Dan Schumacher. All 27 regular season games, plus any Southland Conference or NCAA post-season games will be broadcast on KTSW.

Broadcasts will begin 15 minutes prior to tipoff with Bill Culhane handling the play-by-play call at all home games. Tony Brubaker will handle the play-by-play duties on the road and any post-season. It will be the sixth year for Culhane and it's the ninth year in a row for Brubaker to serve as the "Voice of the Bobcats."

TELEVISION COVERAGE FOR 2002-03

Southwest Texas Bobcat basketball and the Southland Conference are working together on a television package for a number of regular season SLC games on Fox Sports Southwest.

At press time, no definitive plans have been made, but there are discussions on a package that would include several regular season contests to be aired on Fox during January and February.

In addition, the Southland Conference post-season tournament championship game will be televised on ESPN2. All tournament games will be played at campus sites with the higher seeded team being the host.

MEDIA INFORMATION

The 2002-03 edition of the Southwest Texas Basketball Media Guide has been produced to assist you with your coverage of the Bobcats. Additional information, including media releases, photographs and statistics are available upon request.

STRAHAN COLISEUM

The Southwest Texas basketball press row is located on the north side of the playing floor, across from the team benches. The media entrance to the arena is the southeast entrance of the coliseum. That entrance is also used for WILL CALL pick-up of passes. Parking is located just off the southeast corner of the facility for media with proper credentials.

GAME CREDENTIALS

Credentials for Southwest Texas home games are issued for working media only and must be requested through Assistant Athletic Director Tony Brubaker, preferably well in advance. Credentials will be mailed when time allows, otherwise they will be left at WILL CALL.

PHOTO PASSES

Only photographers on assignment from a periodical will be issued credentials. Photographers are requested to abide by guidelines set forth by the NCAA on shooting limitations on the sidelines. Those not complying with the guidelines may be removed.

STATISTICS/SERVICES

Packets, including statistics, pre-game notes and media guides, will be available along press row prior to the game. Halftime and final stats will be provided to all media. Soft drinks are available throughout the contest.

TELEPHONES

There are a limited number of telephone lines for use in the main media area. A fax machine is also available upon prior notice.

There will be one courtesy line available for the visiting team's "official" radio station." Stations or writers wishing to have another line installed should make their own arrangements through SWT Telephone Services at 512-245-2525.

POST GAME INTERVIEWS

Following the game, Head Coach Dennis Nutt will return to the floor for a post-game radio interview. He will remain there to handle any further media questions. Players will also be available after the customary "cooling off" period following the game. The SWT locker room will not be open to the media prior to or after the game.

COVERING PRACTICE

Practice sessions are open to the media and have a usual starting time of 3:30 p.m. Media are encouraged to contact the Athletic Media Relations office to arrange easy access to players and coaches prior to the start of practice.

PHONE INTERVIEWS

The Athletic Media Relations office would prefer media members to arrange all phone interviews a day in advance to make scheduling easier. Most player phone requests will be returned between 2:15 p.m. and 2:45 p.m. No telephone interviews are allowed on game days.

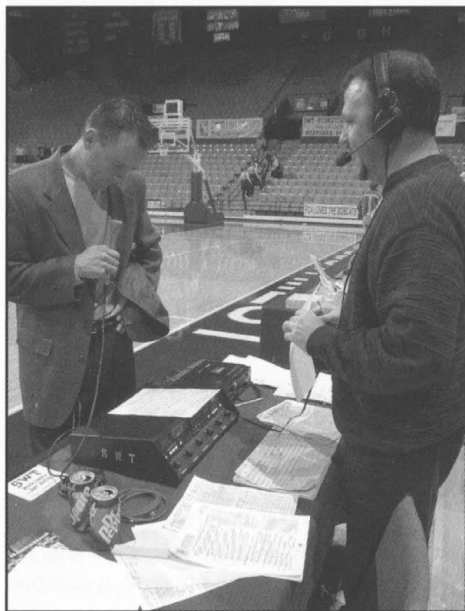

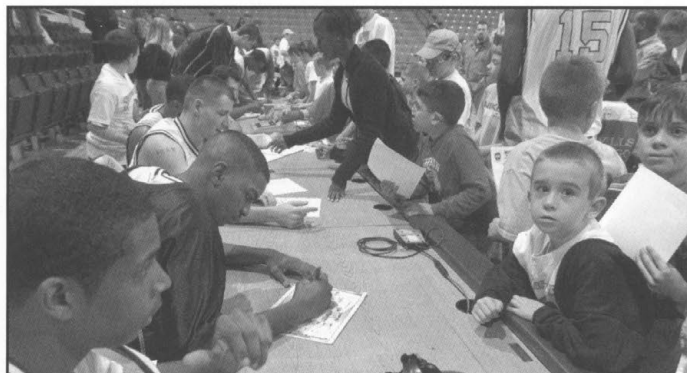

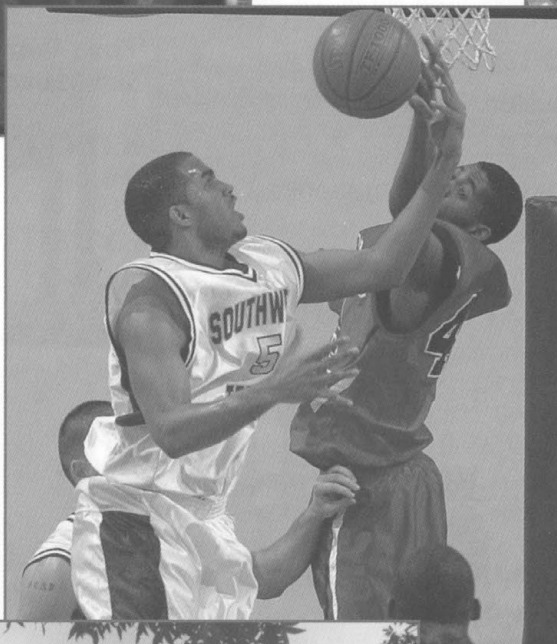

The word is out. Southwest Texas has been tabbed by numerous national publications over the past several years as a “best buy” or a “hot spot” in higher education. It doesn’t get much better.

Highly acclaimed *Money* magazine has listed SWT among the best values in public colleges. Meanwhile, SWT has been singled out by the likes of *Newsweek* as a hot spot to go to school.

In other words, *Southwest Texas is the right place to be and it’s currently the right time to be here!*





THIS IS SOUTHWEST TEXAS

- Admission standards at SWT are among the highest in Texas for public colleges and universities.

- The 2002 fall semester saw a record enrollment at SWT, with 25,045 students taking classes on campus in San Marcos and at the North Austin-Williamson County Multi Institution Teaching Center.

- Southwest Texas is the 74th largest school by enrollment among 2,335 schools in the NCAA across the country.

- Retention rates at SWT increased from 57 percent in 1988 to 75 percent in 2001.

- The Centennial Campaign, the first-ever major gifts campaign at SWT, concluded by surpassing its original goal of \$60 million by 23 percent, raising \$74 million for the university.

- Endowment at SWT has grown from \$15 million to \$55 million over the past 15 years, while private gifts have jumped from \$500,000 a year to over \$15 million.

- SWT signed a formal partnership with Texas Parks and Wildlife to establish the Texas Rivers Center at San Marcos Springs. Located at the Aquarena Center on campus, the multimillion-dollar Rivers Center will help educate the public about the importance of our water resources and how water operates as a system.

- A gift from the Roy and Joann Cole Mitte Foundation established five \$1 million endowed chairs to bring outstanding faculty members to the SWT campus. Mitte Chairs were created in creative writing, entrepreneurial studies, managed health care, cancer research and semiconductor development.

- SWT awarded the first two doctoral degrees in the school's history. Lisa DeChano and Todd Votteler earned doctoral degrees in environmental geography at the 2000 spring commencement ceremony.

- There are now five doctoral programs at SWT in environmental geography, geographic education, geographic information science, school improvement, and adult, professional and community education.

- Grant-funded research increased from \$3.9 million in 1988 to \$41.8 million last year.

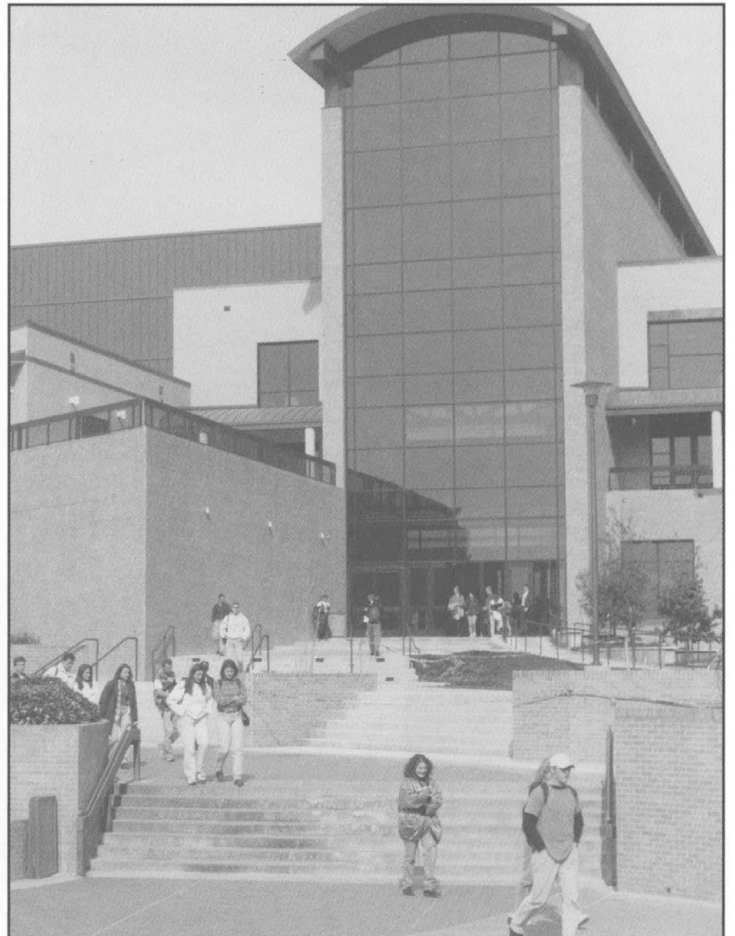
- The SWT School of Business is accredited by the American Assembly of Collegiate Schools of Business. Fewer than 25% of schools in the nation hold such accreditation.

- The SWT Physics Department was one of five physics programs nationwide cited by the American Physical Society for innovation in preparing students for good jobs. Others cited were MIT, LSU, Rutgers and Morehead State.

- With \$1.8 million in funding from the Kellogg Foundation and the Houston Endowment, SWT formed a partnership with other South Texas colleges to launch an aggressive new program aimed at raising the educational expectations in South Texas Latino communities.

- SWT's technology program is the only one in Texas and one of two in the South accredited by the America Foundryman's Society.

- SWT is among the top three teacher certification universities in Texas.



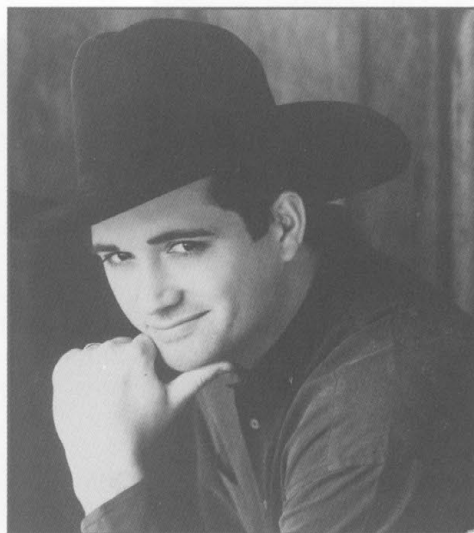

SAN MARCOS, TEXAS

San Marcos is located in the southeastern part of Hays County and serves as county seat for 670 square miles. Its proximity to the headwaters of the San Marcos River played a great part in the development of the city. The unusual river, according to legend, was discovered by a group of Franciscan Monks in 1790 on St. Mark's Day. They honored the patron saint by naming the river in his honor.

The new County of Hays -- named after Captain Jack Hays, a noted Indian fighter and Texas Ranger -- was founded on March 1, 1848.

The city and the university have been in partnership from the beginning. The citizens of San Marcos put up the capital to purchase the land that was donated to the State of Texas to create Southwest Texas State Normal in 1899.

San Marcos is 30 miles south of Austin and 45 miles north of San Antonio on Interstate 35. The scenic beauty is an asset that makes San Marcos different from other towns.

The land to the east of the city is commonly referred to as blackland prairie and is made of rich, fertile soil. To the east is the steeply rolling and limestone cliff Hill Country.

Summers are very warm (96 degree average) while Spring and Fall are mild. Winters are usually not severe and are short lived (53 degree average). The average yearly rainfall is 35.6 inches with a growing season of 254 days, and Hays County elevation ranges from 600 to 1,600 feet above sea level.



SAN MARCOS, TEXAS

AMBIENCE

Natives and newcomers alike find a wonderful environment in which to work and play. The centerpiece of San Marcos is the remarkable spring-fed San Marcos River that meanders through the city between park-lined banks. Historic districts include the National Register Districts of Belvin Street and the Courthouse Square.

OUTDOOR RECREATION

The San Marcos River is the focus of many parks which form a green belt through the city. Picnic areas, recreation buildings, an olympic- sized swimming pool, tennis courts, baseball fields, and one of the largest Playscapes in the nation are sprinkled throughout the city's nine parks. Outdoor recreation is a way of life in San Marcos' inviting climate.

SHOPPING

San Marcos offers the best in shopping opportunities from serious shopping to browsing. The historic Courthouse Square area offers a potpourri of shops referred to as the Texas Natural marketplace, while the Prime Outlets of San Marcos and Tanger Factory Outlet Center are some of the busiest shopping areas in the state. In addition, located strategically throughout town are various shopping centers including Springtown Center, San Mar Plaza, San Marcos Place, Nelson Center and Papillon Village.

SPECIAL EVENTS

It seems as though there is always a celebration in San Marcos. Spring events include Carnival! in February; the Blue-bonnet Kite Festival in April; Historic Home Tour; Viva! Cinco de Mayo and the Texas Natural Weekend in May. Summer events include the Texas Water Safari in June and the San Marcos Performing Arts Association's free Summer in the Park concert series June through August. Fall brings Chilympiad, a world famous chili cookoff the third weekend in September and the Sights and Sounds of Christmas in early December along the San Marcos River Walk.



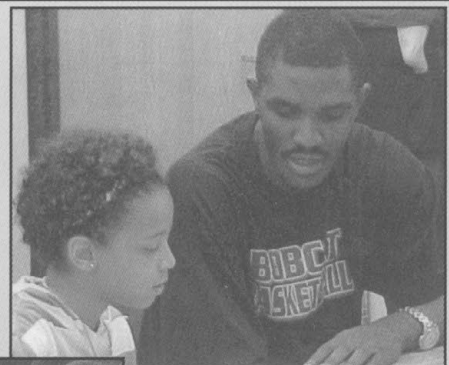

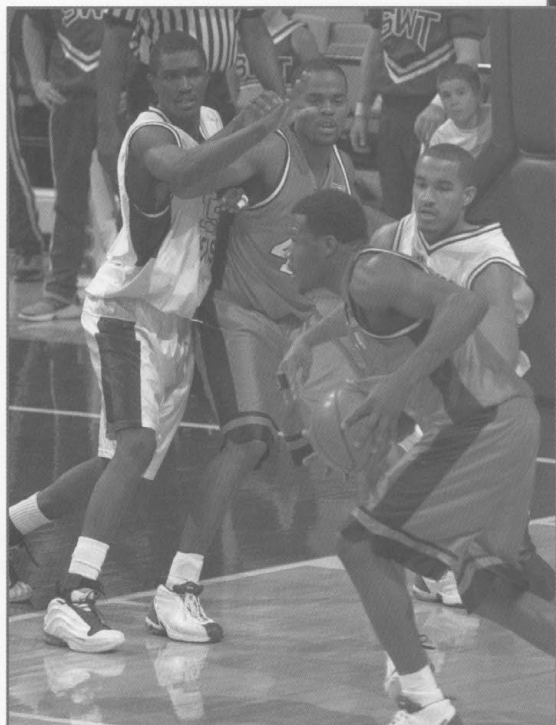
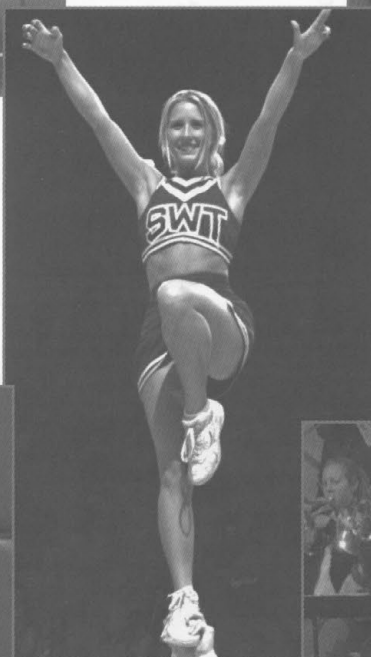
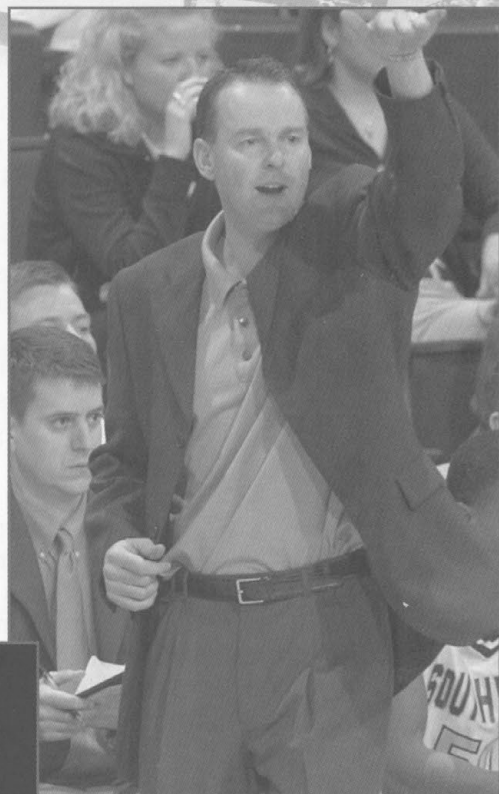
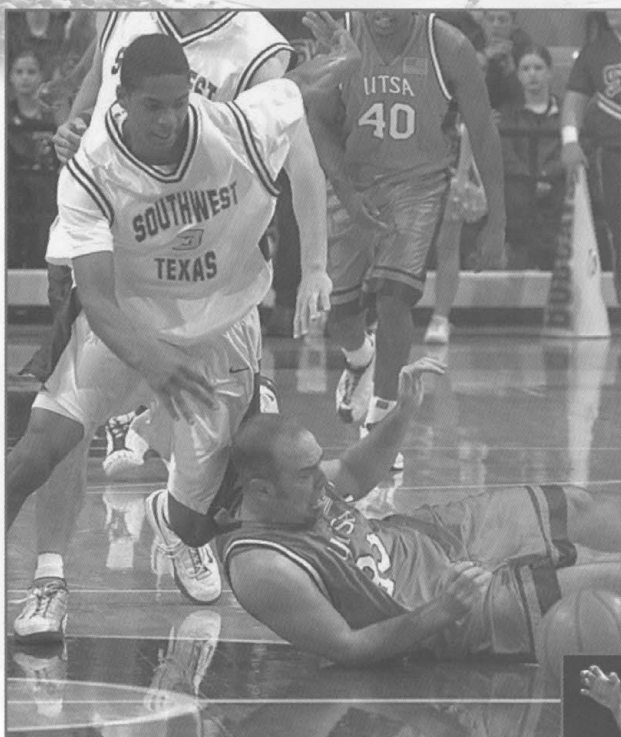
A major feature of the program is the team's reading effort at San Marcos' Hernandez Elementary School.

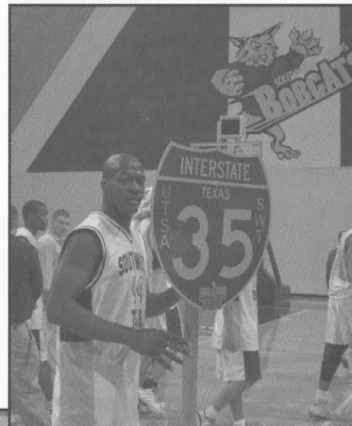
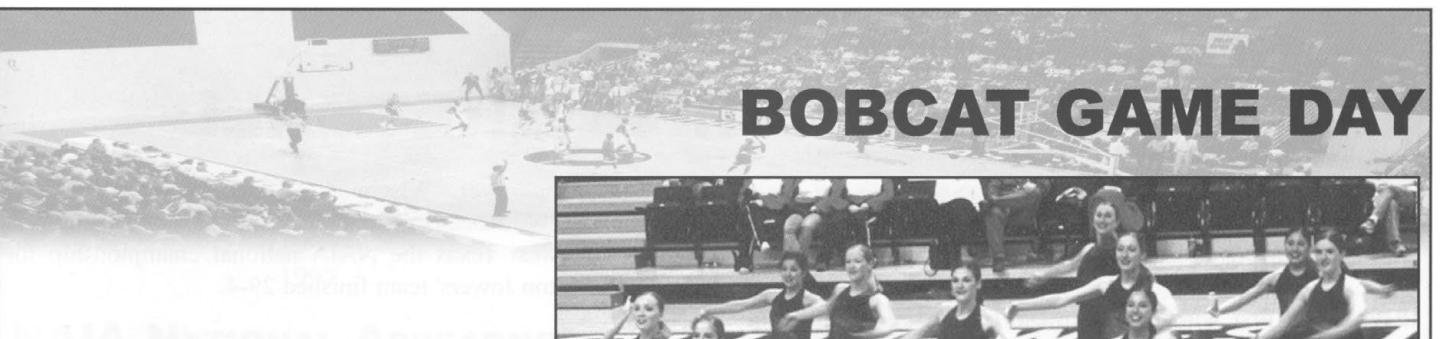

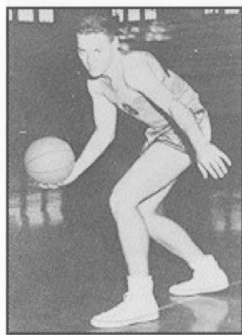
HISTORY OF BOBCAT BASKETBALL

There is documentation back to 1920 about Southwest Texas and its basketball playing fortunes for the men. The following are some of the highlights of more than 80 years of the game.

1920 - The first win for Southwest Texas came in its fifth game of the 1920 season in a 25-19 victory over Howard Payne. The win came just a few days after a 21-16 loss and was one of three wins over the Yellow Jackets.

1933 - Southwest Texas earned its 100th victory under coach Harry G. Shands in a 35-22 win over Trinity.

1944 - Southwest Texas was unable to field a team due to World War II.



Lewis Gilcrease and Pence Dacus were two of the standout players in the 1950's.



1950 - Southwest Texas claimed its first conference championship under legendary coach Milton Jowers.

1951 - Just one year later, Southwest Texas and Jowers made the school's first appearance at a national tournament, winning the NAIA District 4 title and advancing to Kansas City.

1952 - In arguably the program's finest season, Southwest Texas finished 30-1, including the 300th win in school history, with its only loss to Southwest Missouri State, 70-67 in overtime, in the NAIA national semifinals. SWT rebounded to defeat Portland 78-68 to finish third.

1959 - Southwest Texas finished third for the second time at the NAIA national tournament in Kansas City with a 27-6 record. It was the school's fourth appearance at the national tournament in the 1950's.



Southwest Texas became a fixture at the NAIA national tournament, winning it all in 1960.

1960 - Wins over Wisconsin State, Savannah State, Grambling, William Jewell and Westminster of Pennsylvania gave Southwest Texas the NAIA national championship for 1960 as Milton Jowers' team finished 29-4.

1961 - New head coach Vernon McDonald helped SWT to the program's 500th win early in the 1961-62 season.

1979 - Southwest Texas advanced to the NAIA national tournament under Coach Dan Wall and finished third for the third time in school history. The team finished 29-7.

1984 - Southwest Texas made the jump to NCAA Division I under Coach Celester Collier and joined the Gulf Star Conference.

1987 - In the second season for Coach Harry Larrabee, Southwest Texas moved into the Southland Conference.

1994 - Making history in his third season at Southwest Texas' head coach, Jim Wooldridge guided the Bobcats to a 25-7 campaign and the first NCAA Division I post-season appearance. On the way to the "Big Dance," SWT won three games at the 1994 SLC tournament, the school's first three SLC post-season victories. The Bobcats took on Massachusetts at the NCAA Regional in Wichita, Kan.

1997 - For the second time in four years, Southwest Texas advanced to the NCAA Tournament, after winning a share of the SLC regular season title and the SLC post-season Classic. SWT also posted the program's 1000th victory on Jan. 4, 1997 with an 82-73 win over Nicholls State.

1999 - Southwest Texas won its first outright regular season SLC Title with a 13-5 record. The Bobcats also achieved national acclaim by finishing second in the nation in field goal defense, allowing opponents to shoot just 37.3 percent. SWT made history again when 6-foot-11 forward Jeff Foster was selected with the 21st pick of the first round of the 1999 NBA Draft.

2000 - Southwest Texas welcomed Dennis Nutt as its new head coach, the 14th head coach in SWT men's basketball history.

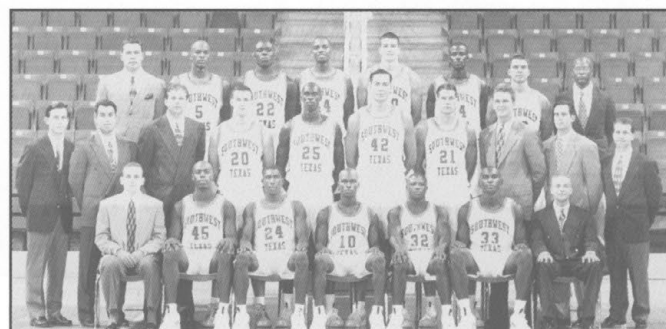

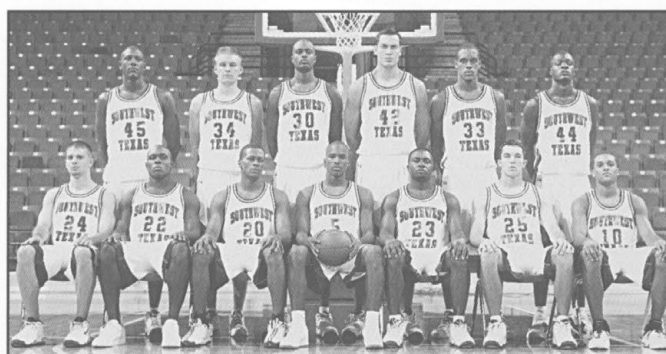

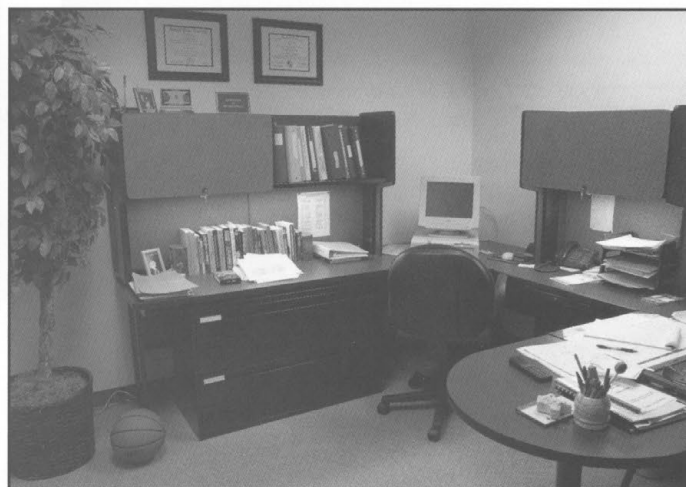

SWT AND THE STUDENT-ATHLETE

ATHLETIC ACADEMIC CENTER (AAC)

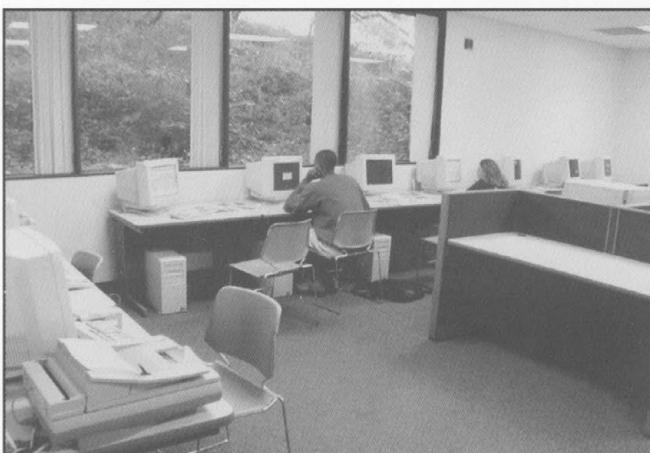
The AAC is centrally located on campus on the second floor of Academic Services Building-North, in close proximity to University College, and the TASP office.

The AAC, which is open from 8 a.m. - 10 p.m. Monday through Thursday, 8 a.m.- 5 p.m. on Friday, and 6 p.m. - 10 p.m. on Sunday, houses a computer lab with 20 desktop computers, as well as nine laptop computers, a scanner, color printer, and a laser jet printer. All the computers have Internet access as well as email capabilities. The AAC also has 10 individual cubicles for individual or small group studying or 1-on-1 tutorial sessions, an open lounge area, a conference room with a TV, VCR, and DVD, and a group study room available for use during study hall or group tutorials. A full-time director, two full-time interns, as well as a computer coordinator and a tutor coordinator, staff the AAC.

The AAC is involved with every aspect of a student-athlete's academic life while at SWT. This relationship begins with the recruiting process, followed by new student orientation and "Paws Preview," then continuing on to cover perhaps the main emphasis of the AAC, the "first-year college experience." The staff of the AAC works in conjunction with the academic advisors in the student athlete's major to assist in course selection each semester. The AAC also helps with the selection of a major while working in tandem with Career Services and the different academic departments on campus. The staff of the AAC, as well as the Compliance Coordinator, strives to educate the student-athletes of the various NCAA rules and regulations, while at the same time monitoring their coursework for continuing eligibility. These steps, along with the components of the NCAA CHAMPS/Life Skills program, ultimately assist the student-athlete on through his/her ultimate goal of graduation and a career choice.

AAC TUTORING CENTER

The Athletic Academic Center provides a comprehensive tutoring program for student athletes. Tutors are available for all General Studies courses, as well as for a wide variety of upper division course. Tutors include upper classmen and graduate students. The AAC also refers student-athletes to various other academic services on the SWT campus; most notably SLAC (Student Learning Assistance Center located in Alkek Library) The AAC has private tutoring rooms, as well as a large study area.



THE ACADEMIC NOTEBOOK

The Academic Notebook is a manual and notebook specifically designed to monitor special populations of students. The Notebook was begun in 1995 as a program to assure the academic success of student-athletes at Southwest Texas. The program has achieved much success in a short time.

This program assists student-athletes with time management skills, study and note-taking skills, and one to one mentoring. Graduate students as well as tutors serve as peer mentors who assist the student-athletes in setting their academic goals and tracking their academic progress. The Notebook Program, or components of it, are mandatory for all freshmen and transfer student-athletes, as well as those returning athletes facing present or imminent academic challenges.

THE ATHLETIC ACADEMIC AWARDS

The Department of Athletics and Oak Farms Dairy sponsor the annual Athletic Academic Achievement Awards. The ceremony is held as a congratulatory gesture for student-athletes who have achieved academic excellence at SWT and have earned Southland Conference honors for academic achievement. Student-athletes who have achieved a 4.0 grade point average are awarded a framed award and those who have achieved a 3.0 grade point average and above are awarded a certificate or poster for their achievement.

SWAT- SOUTHWEST ATHLETICS TOGETHER

S.W.A.T. is the Southwest Texas student-athlete advisory council. One purpose of this council is to act as a liaison between the Athletic Department and the student body regarding the needs and concerns that have an impact on their academic performance and personal well-being. S.W.A.T. also acts as a liaison to the University community by providing information on the unique needs and accomplishments of the student-athlete body. The council is composed of interested student-athletes from all teams who are willing to improve their leadership skills and represent the voice of the SWT student-athletes.

THE RING

The "Bobcat Athletic Foundation Academic Ring" is symbolic of not only excellence on the playing field, but in the classroom, as well.

The Southwest Texas State University athletic program initiated the program in May of 1986 and a total of 569 student-athletes have received a ring by the completion of 2002 summer semester.

Criteria for receiving the graduation ring are the following:

1. Must have received the "T" Letter from the Southwest Texas State University Athletic Department.

2. Must have completed their NCAA eligibility with Southwest Texas State University.

3. Must have earned their undergraduate degree from Southwest Texas State within one year after their NCAA eligibility has been completed.

This ring is dedicated to the student-athletes who have contributed their efforts on the field of play and balanced those efforts with a commitment to excellence in the classroom.



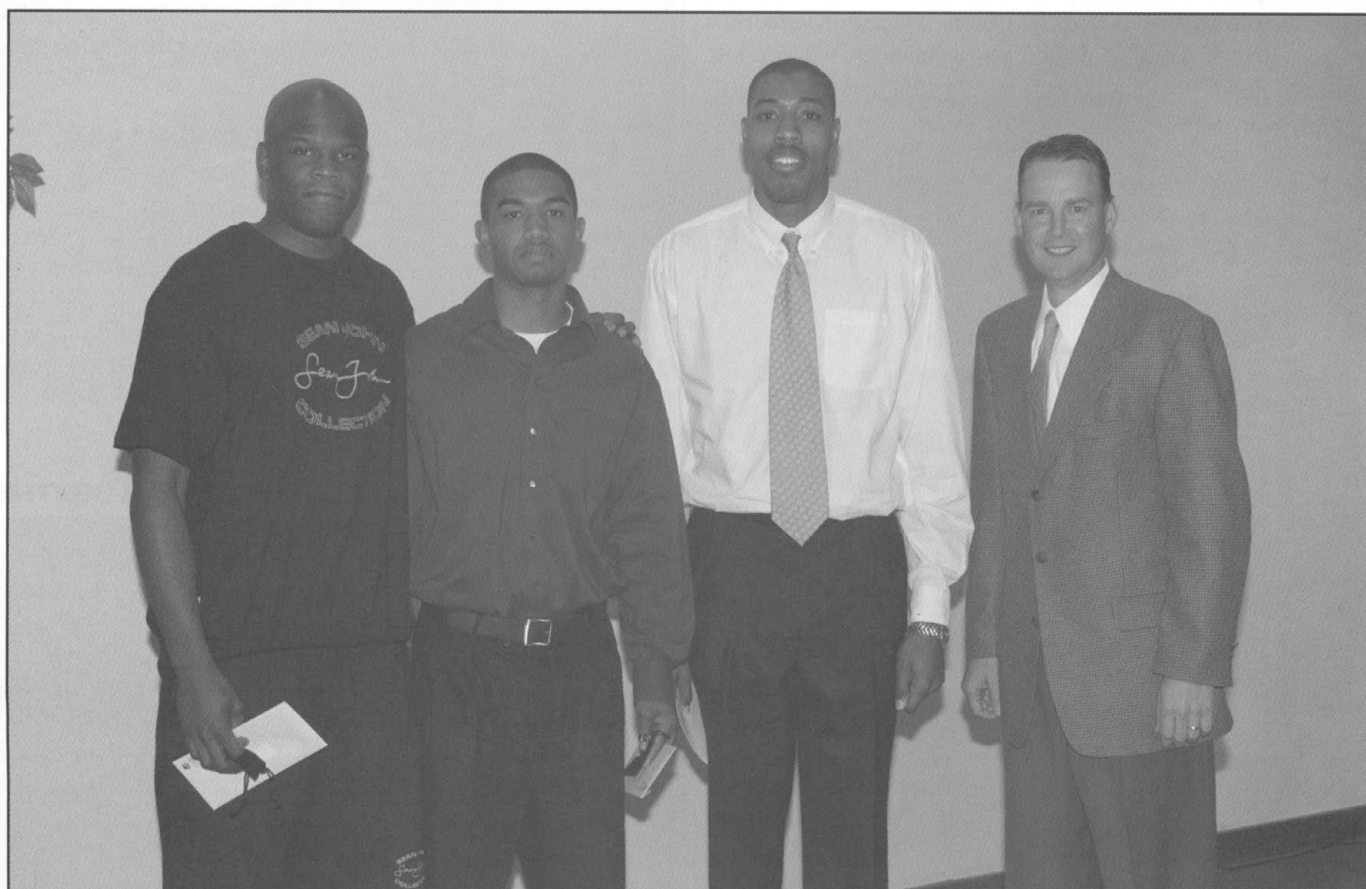

STRENGTH & CONDITIONING

The Southwest Texas student-athletes are evaluated by the strength and conditioning staff to determine each player's strengths and weaknesses.

From the evaluations, the student-athletes are provided a computer generated, individualized strength and conditioning program. The program is designed to help the student-athletes become the most efficient and injury free as possible.

The weightlifting portion of the program is based on the olympic lifts (snatch, clean and jerk) which enhance the student-athlete's strength and speed development.

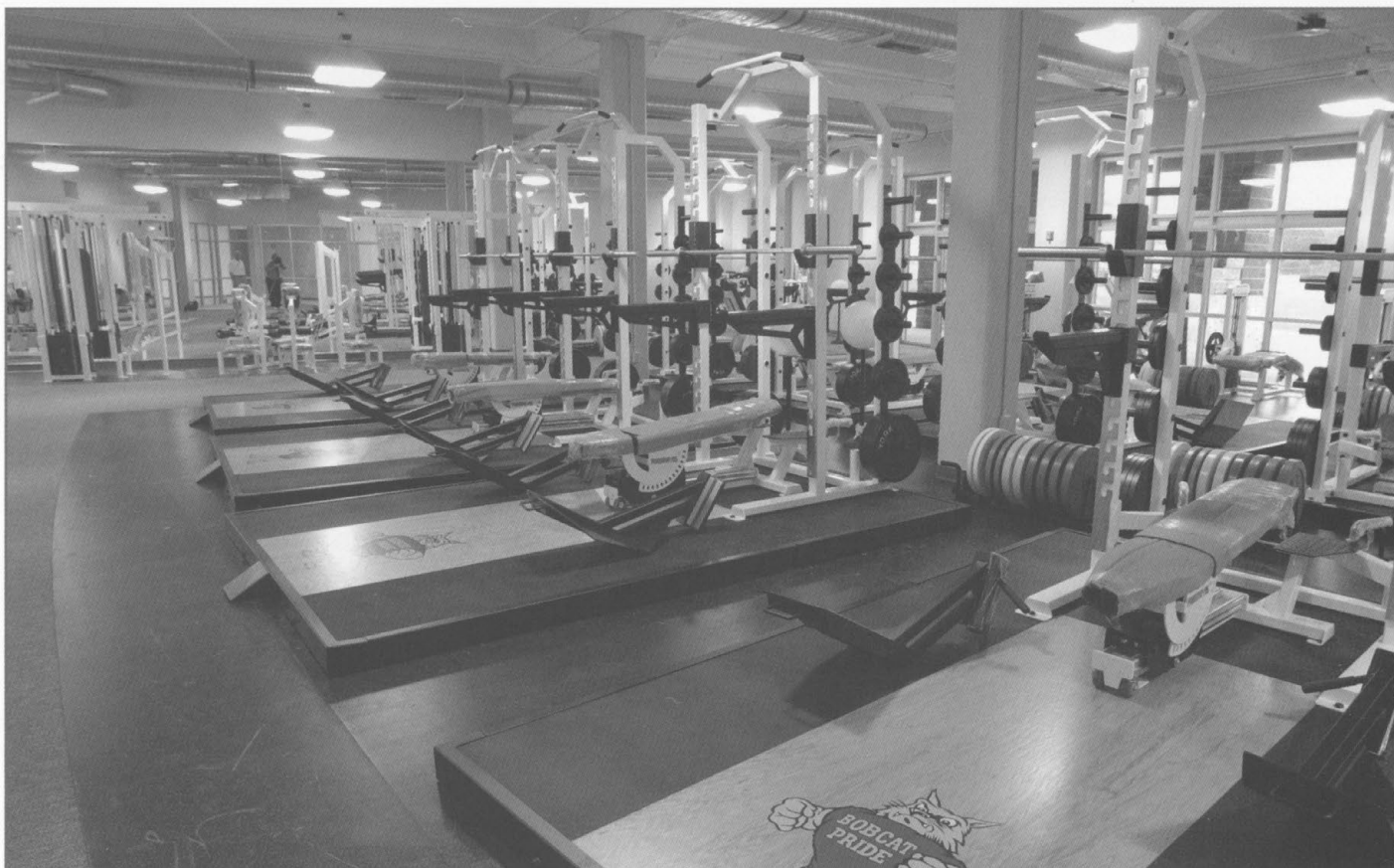
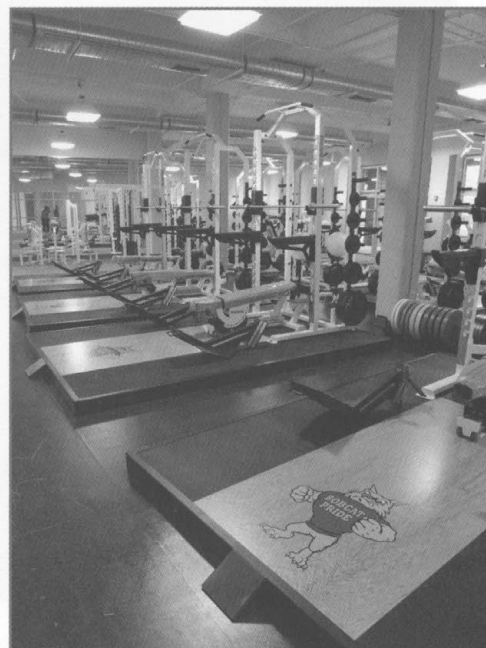
Each student-athlete's progress is monitored and changes are made in the computer as needed to provide the proper load at which to train for maximum results.

The strength and conditioning program is a year-round activity with in-season, off-season and summer workouts provided for each student-athlete. In-season, the younger football student-athlete's training load and intensity are increased to enhance their physical development and prepare them for the future.

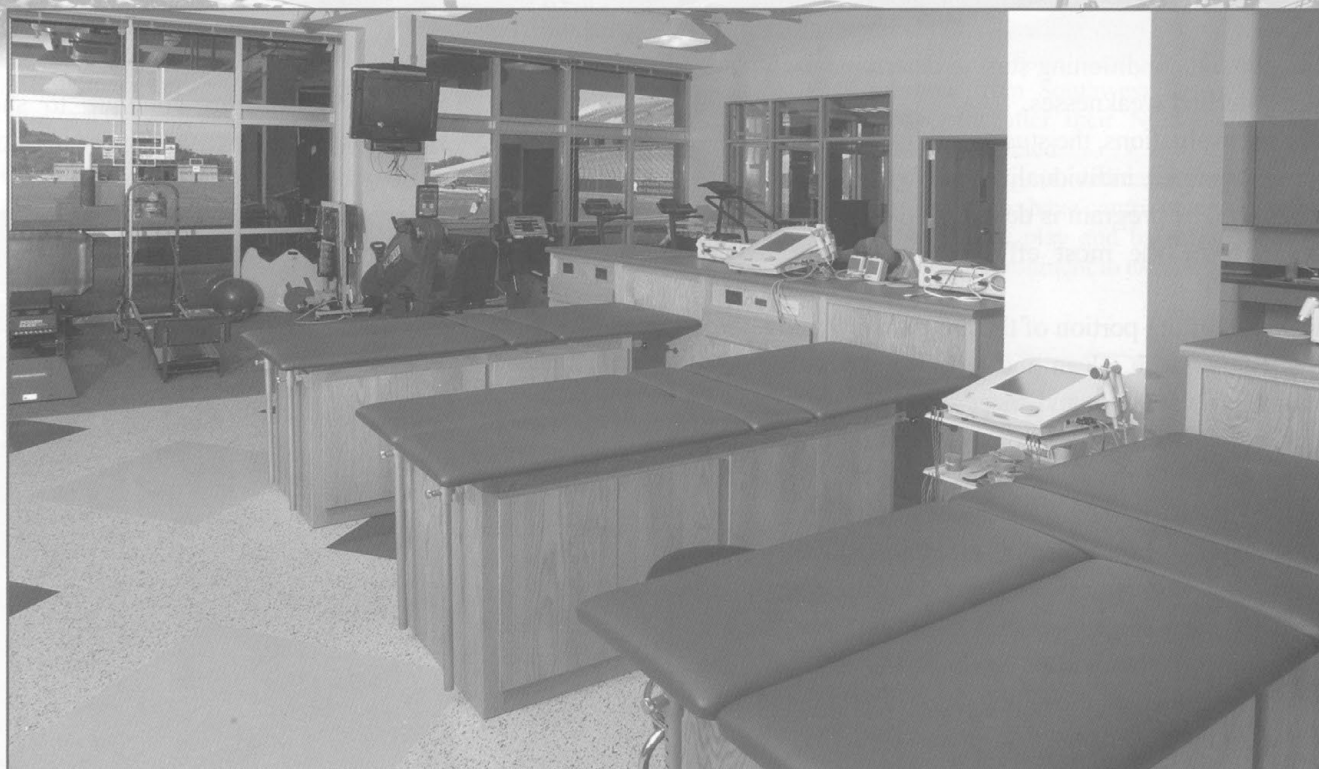
Along with workouts, the student-athletes also receive

education on nutrition and its importance to enhance athletic performance.

Southwest Texas student-athletes continue to show significant increases in strength, power and speed in testing performed by the strength and conditioning staff.



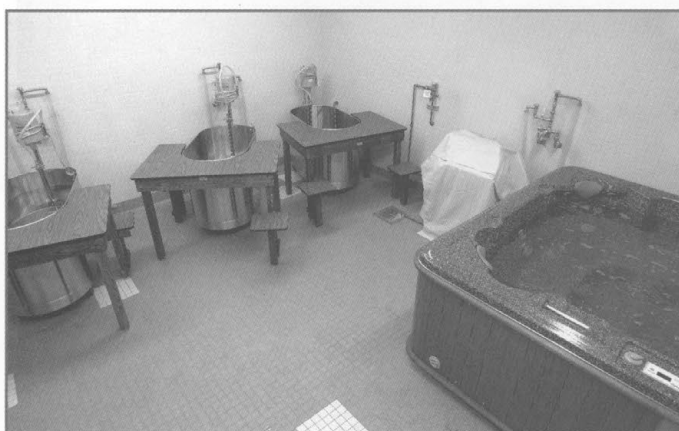
ATHLETIC TRAINING



Southwest Texas houses one of the most comprehensive Athletic Training Education programs in the region, featuring an accredited program. With a staff of five certified athletic trainers, approximately 36 student athletic trainers, four orthopedic surgeons serving as team physicians, and Central Texas Medical Center providing diagnostic and surgical facilities, SWT athletes are provided with a coeducational athletic health care environment.

The Athletic Training Education Program has produced over 160 graduates since 1972, who are now working as licensed and certified athletic trainers in high schools, colleges and sports medicine clinics across the country.

Providing quality health care for SWT student-athletes is the primary goal of the sports medicine team.

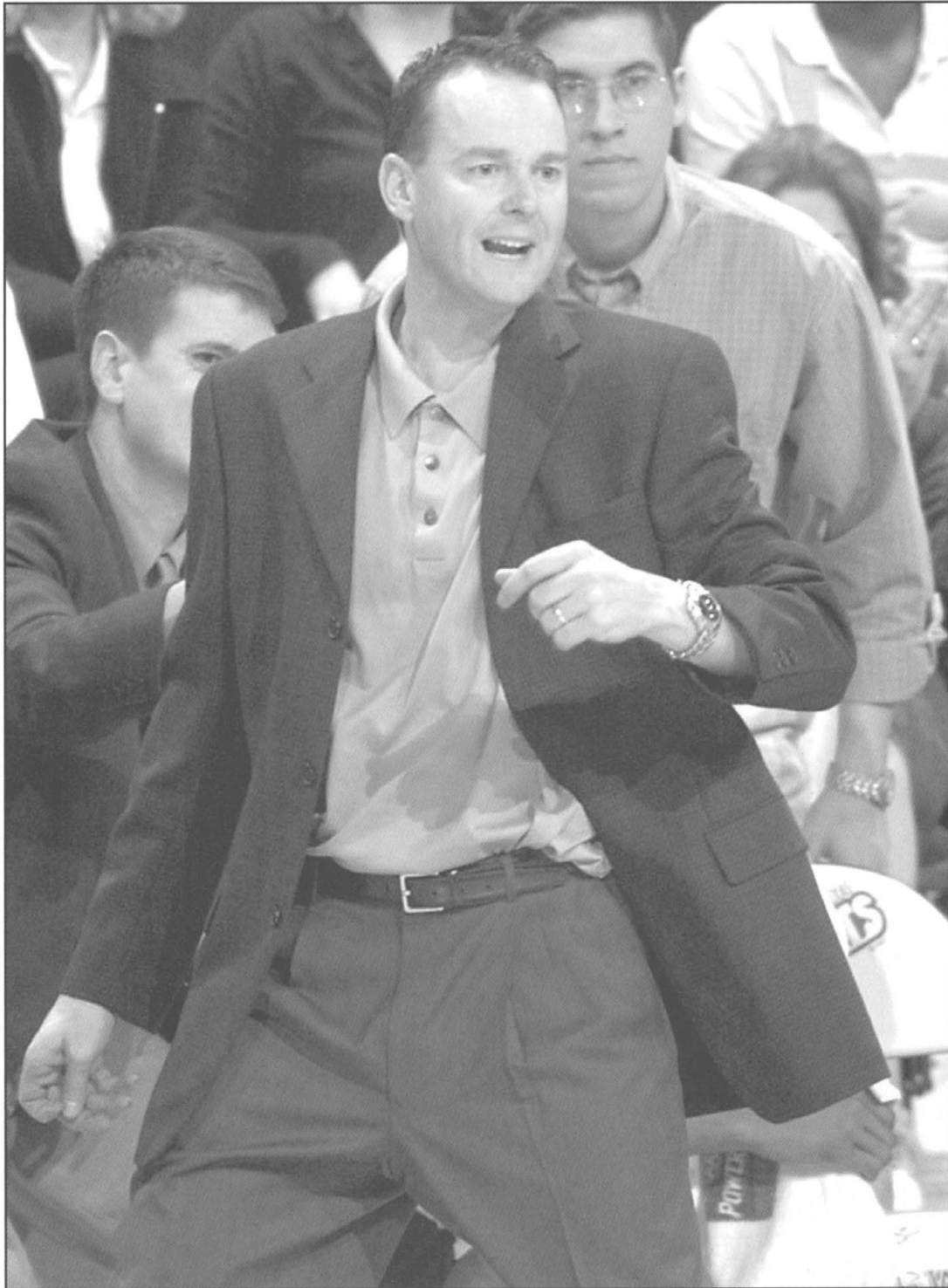

THE COACHES

HEAD COACH DENNIS NUTT

Southwest Texas head men's basketball coach Dennis Nutt is known as one very positive person. The kind of guy who sees the cup half full and not half empty.

With that in mind, he has a basketball program that is on the rise.

Back-to-back 10-10 Southland Conference finishes may not seem all that positive to some, but the third-year head coach knows that progress has been and is being made on a daily basis at Southwest Texas.

"We have seen some ups and downs in our first two years," Nutt said. "But all the hard work and all the time put in laying a solid foundation is starting to pay off."

"The way we finished last season, the way we defended people means to me that we are moving in the right direction."

Nutt returns but four letter winners for the 2002-03 season but looks to a host of newcomers and the benefits they will bring to SWT this year.

The senior class is led by David Sykes, the team's leading returning scorer and rebounder from last year. The junior class is led by transfer Roosevelt Brown, a former teammate of Sykes at Duncanville High and a former Texas Longhorn, and by Terry Conerway, a junior college All-American who will wear the maroon and gold this season.

The 14-man Bobcat roster will take on a schedule that features 14 home games, including visits from both a Sun Belt and Conference USA team.

Nutt is known for his vast knowledge of the game as well as experience as a collegiate and professional player and was an easy choice for Southwest Texas in April of 2000.

"I love someone that has a zest and enthusiasm for life, and he lights it up," said Jim Wacker, then SWT's Director of Athletics. "It's real. It's nothing phony. He loves coaching, he loves young people, and he has a great basketball background."

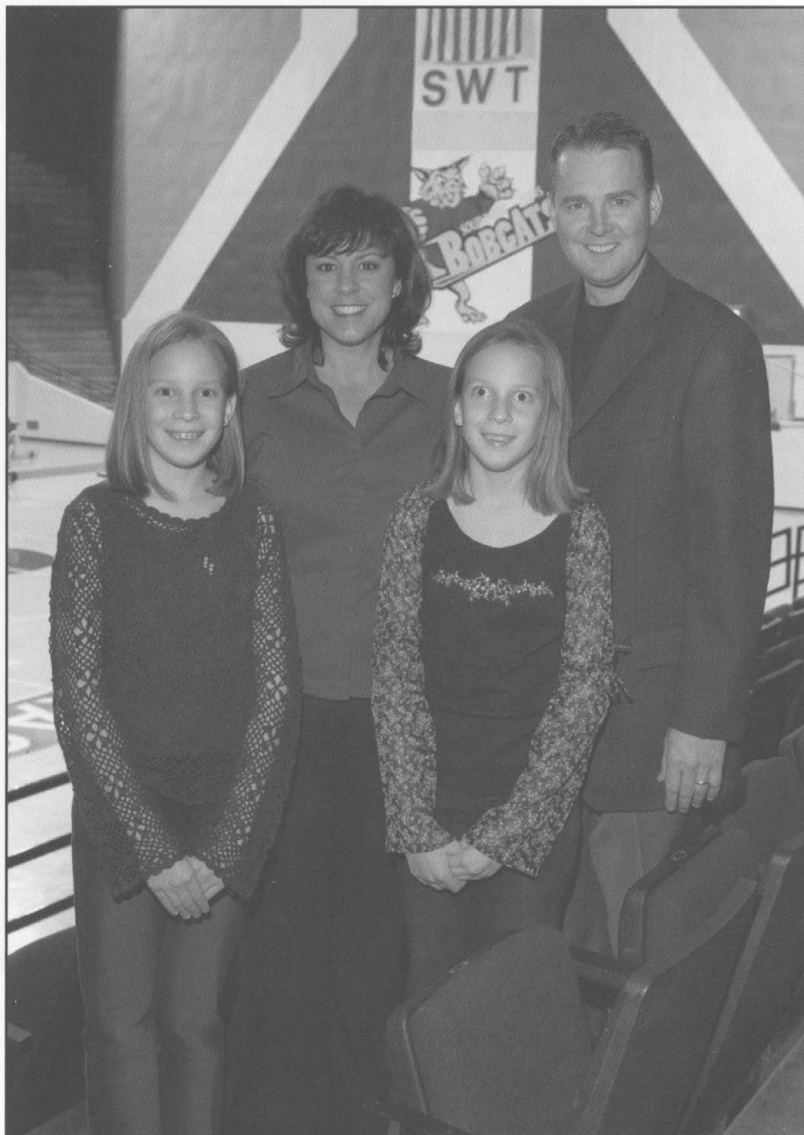
Nutt was an assistant coach at Arkansas State before becoming the 13th men's hoop coach in SWT history.

Nutt worked for his brother Dickey at Arkansas State for five years, helping turn the program around. The Indians were ranked number 300 out of 315 NCAA Division I basketball teams when the Nutts arrived. After five years, Arkansas State

had gone from last in the conference to first, earning a pair of Sun Belt Conference Championships and a berth in the NCAA Field of 64.

Nutt had a standout career at TCU, playing for the Horned Frogs from 1981-85. He was selected to the All-Time Southwest Conference Team after being voted First-Team All-Southwest Conference in 1984 and 85. He was a two-time team MVP, as well, and ranked third nationally in free throw shooting (92%) as a senior. He completed his degree from TCU in 1986.

Nutt continued playing in the CBA in LaCrosse and Sioux Falls before signing with the Dallas Mavericks, where he played for two seasons. Nutt then worked as a graduate assistant coach at Texas A&M for one season before taking one more shot at playing professional basketball. He signed with Real Madrid in Spain, where he spent one season playing for Coach George Karl in the European Basketball Association.

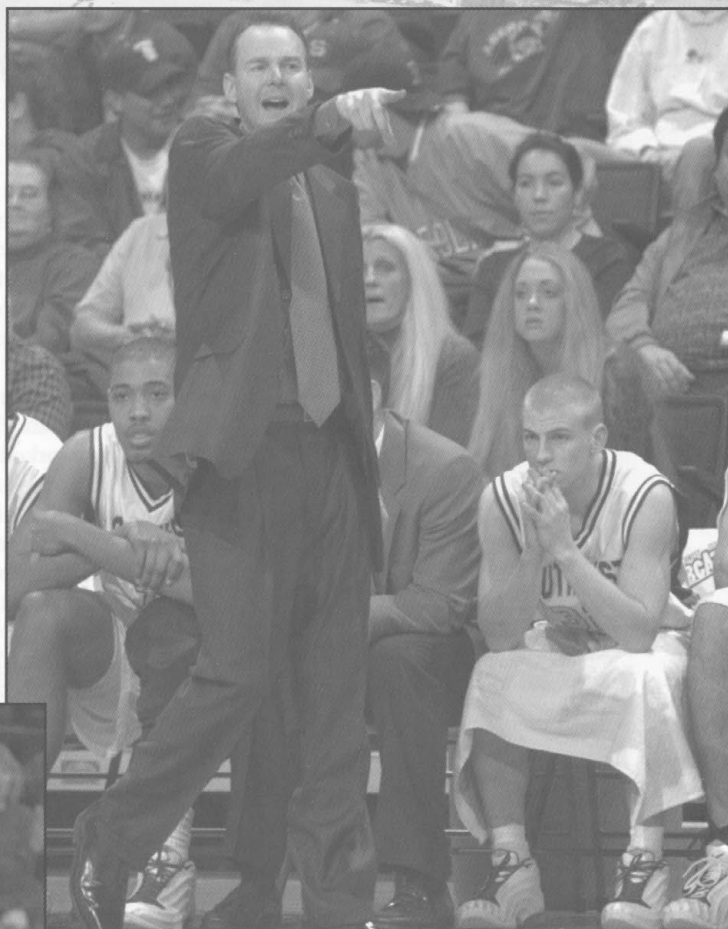
Returning to coaching, Nutt spent four years as an assistant coach at Westark Community College in Fort Smith, helping the school to a 65-26 record from 1991-95. Westark was Bi-State East Conference Champions in 1992.

"I said this when I took the job and it remains true today," Nutt said. "This is a dream come true for me. I have prepared all my life for this opportunity and I am grateful Southwest Texas has given me a chance to do it."

In addition to Dickey at Arkansas State, Dennis Nutt has another brother currently serving as a head coach. Houston is the head football coach at the University of Arkansas, and brother Danny is an assistant coach handling running backs on the Razorback staff. *Sports Illustrated* ran an article on the Nutt family three years ago titled "You've Got to be Nutts."

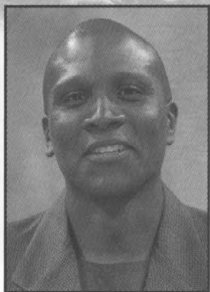
Nutt replaced Mike Miller, who served as the head coach of Southwest Texas for six seasons with an 87-79 record. He left to take the Assistant Head Coach position at Kansas State University.

► Dionne Phelps is in his fourth season at SWT, having spent one season with Mike Miller before the last two years with Dennis Nutt.

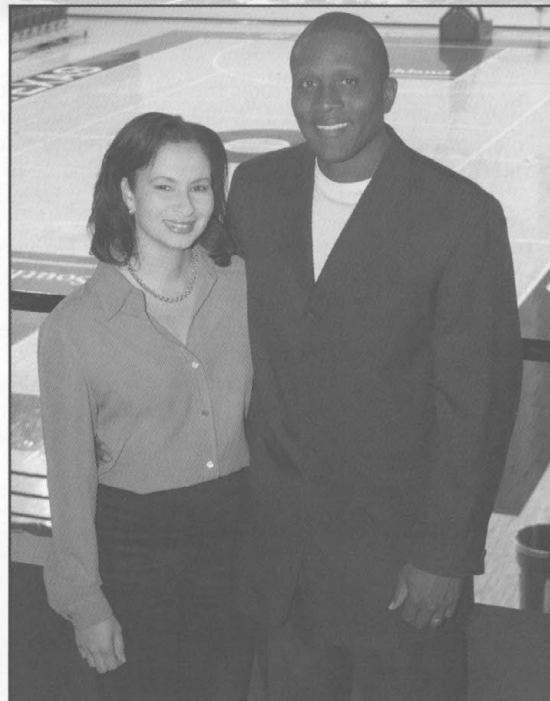
Dionne Phelps returns for his fourth season as an assistant basketball coach at Southwest Texas. It is his third year working under Coach Nutt.

Phelps assists with community services projects and will also help coordinate the Bobcats' summer jobs program.

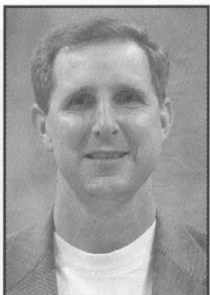

Back for his third season as an assistant basketball coach at Southwest Texas is Greg Young.

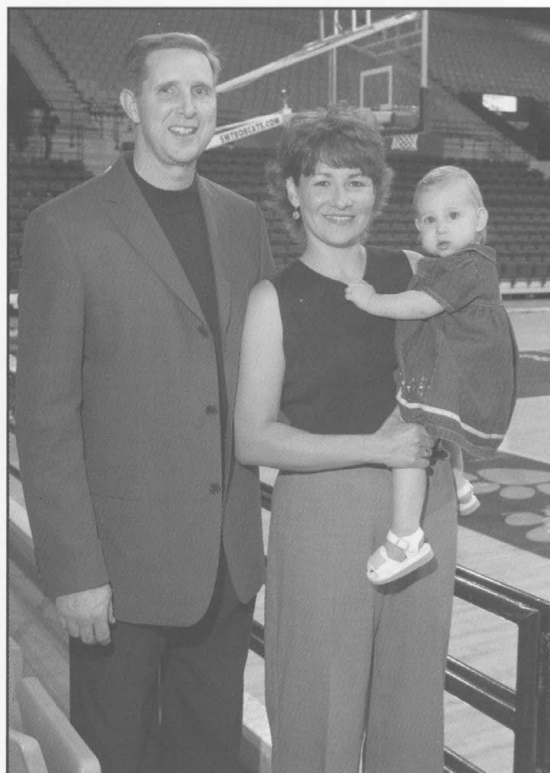
At SWT, Young serves as the Bobcat's recruiting coordinator and handles the operation of the men's basketball recruiting budget.

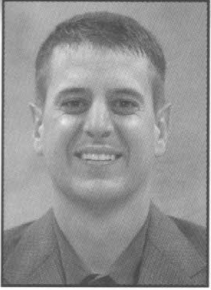

► Clark Sheehy is in his third season on the Bobcat Basketball coaching staff.

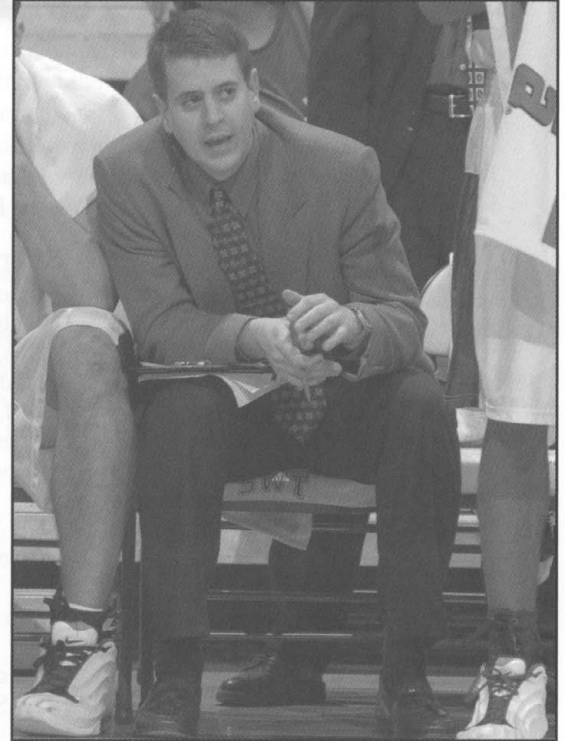
Clark Sheehy is an assistant basketball coach at Southwest Texas, also in his third season with the Bobcats.

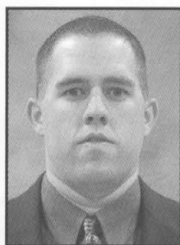

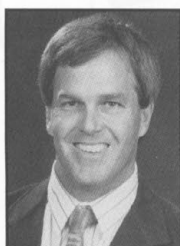

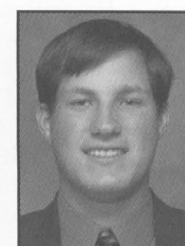

PRESIDENT DENISE TRAUTH



Denise M. Trauth was named the ninth president of Southwest Texas State University on June 11, 2002.

Dr. Trauth came to SWT from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte, where she served as provost and vice chancellor for academic affairs. Before taking that job, she served as dean of the UNCC Graduate School and as a professor of communication studies.

"I think I am home at Southwest Texas State University," Trauth said. "From the very first moments when I met with the search committee, I have felt that Southwest Texas is the right place for me. It is a growing, dynamic, complex and wonderful institution, poised for greatness."

As provost at UNCC, she led the university's successful push to be reclassified as a Carnegie Doctoral/ Research Intensive institution. Other accomplishments included leading the school through two rounds of strategic planning with the adoption of two campus wide academic plans, the recruiting of five new deans and three associate vice chancellors, organizing and implementing a discipline-based equity study for faculty salaries and overseeing a review and revision of undergraduate general education requirements. She also oversaw the formation

of the College of Information Technology and the College of Health and Human Services at UNCC.

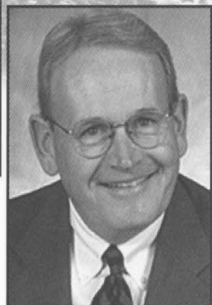
Before joining UNCC, Dr. Trauth was a faculty member and administrator at Bowling Green State University for 16 years. She joined the faculty there as an assistant professor of speech communication and moved up to assistant director of the School of Speech Communication a year later. She became chair of Bowling Green's Department of Telecommunications and later served as associate dean of the university's Graduate College.

Dr. Trauth also served on the faculty of the University of Tulsa from 1974 to 1977.

She holds a bachelor's degree in English literature from the College of Mount St. Joseph in Ohio, a master's degree in journalism from Ohio State University and a Ph.D. in mass communication from the University of Iowa.



VICE PRESIDENT DR. JAMES STUDER



Dr. James D. Studer is in his 12th year as the Vice President for Student Affairs at Southwest Texas.

In his role as Vice President, Studer is responsible for directing, coordinating, and giving leadership to many student life services and programs on the SWT campus. Some of those functions are Admissions, Athletics, Student Financial Aid, Counseling, Career Services, Commuter Services, Orientation, Alcohol and Drug Resource Center, Dean of Students, Student Center, Campus Activities and Programs, Greek Life, Disability Services, Students' Legal Advisor, Student Justice, Residence Life, Student Mentoring Program, Multicultural Student Affairs, Recreational Sports, Student Health Service, Student Support Services, Upward Bound, Youth Opportunities Unlimited, Talent Search, Student Volunteer Center and the University Police Department.

Studer is also an Associate Professor in the Department of Educational Administration and Psychological Services and teaches two courses each year in the Student Affairs Master's of Education program.

In his role of overseeing Athletics, Studer maintains the department is moving in a positive direction.

"We have seen success with another Commissioner's Cup victory for athletics," Studer said. "Plus, the budget is balanced and the academic performance of our student-athletes is excellent."

"With construction complete on the new end zone facility, we have taken a great step forward to improve our front porch (athletics). We appreciate the support of our fans and friends as we continue the capital facilities plan over the next several years."

Prior to coming to SWT, Studer was the Assistant Vice President for Student Affairs and Services and Director of Student Life at Michigan State University for ten and a half years. He was also an Assistant Adjunct Professor of Higher Education at Michigan State as well as the Associate Program Director of the MSU Health Promotion Program.

Other professional positions Studer has held are Dean of Student Life at Ohio Wesleyan University in Delaware, Ohio (1969-1980) and Assistant and Associate Dean of Students at The Defiance College in Defiance, Ohio (1965-1969).

Studer received a bachelor's from The Defiance College (biology), a master's from Bowling Green State University (counseling and guidance) and his Ph.D. from The Ohio State University (Higher Education Administration). He also holds certificates from the Harvard University Management Development Program and the Texas Governor's Executive Development Program.

He was married to the late Dr. Lesley Jones, a Clinical and Neuro Psychologist who was an Associate Professor of Counseling at SWT. He has three children: Kristine (34), Craig (30), and Kyle (16).

Dr. Studer is a member of Rotary International, the San Marcos Chamber of Commerce, the SWT Bobcat Club and the United Methodist Church.

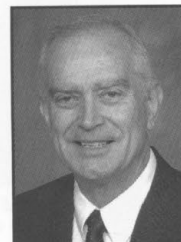

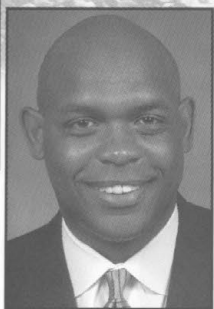

DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS GREG LAFLEUR



Greg LaFleur begins his second year as Director of Athletics at Southwest Texas with a strong first season of success and accomplishments under his belt.

LaFleur directed the sports program to a Southland Conference Commissioner's Cup victory in his first year with five women's sport titles and one on the men's side. The Commissioner's Cup win was the second in three years for

Southwest Texas.

In addition, LaFleur has continued the facility upgrade project. The first task of completion was the new endzone complex at Bobcat Stadium and the installation of the new AstroPlay synthetic turf on the playing field. The facility project also includes the completion of new offices and locker room upgrades in Strahan Coliseum for volleyball, men's and women's basketball.

The project will also include a new administrative office complex adjacent to Strahan Coliseum. That portion of the

project began this fall.

LaFleur was introduced to the San Marcos and Southwest Texas communities in July 2001 by Dr. Jerome Supple. SWT's former President pointed to the background of LaFleur as the biggest reason for his success.

"We were looking for a talented, committed, experienced and energetic individual," Dr. Supple said, "one who understands collegiate athletics, the needs of student-athletes and the importance of doing things the right way."

Formerly an Associate Athletic Director at Louisiana State University, LaFleur became the seventh Athletic Director in SWT history.

Among the initial points of emphasis for LaFleur remain the need to increase attendance at all home events and finding more sources for raising external funds.

"One of the most impressive parts of this job is the fact that the foundation was already here," LaFleur said.

LaFleur worked in an administrative role at LSU for 12 years, the last ten as Associate Athletic Director. LaFleur supervised concessions (\$3 million revenue), merchandising (\$1.7 million revenue), game management and student services. LaFleur supervised and evaluated 12 head coaches and support personnel, coordinated departmental budgets and approved all schedules. He also solicited bids to host championship events at LSU.

He was a member of the NCAA Championship/Competition Cabinet as the SEC representative. In addition, he served as a peer reviewer for the past five years and as a representative for NCAA Women's Basketball first and second round games for the past eight years. LaFleur was also a national spokesperson for the Kennedy Center Alliance for Arts Education.

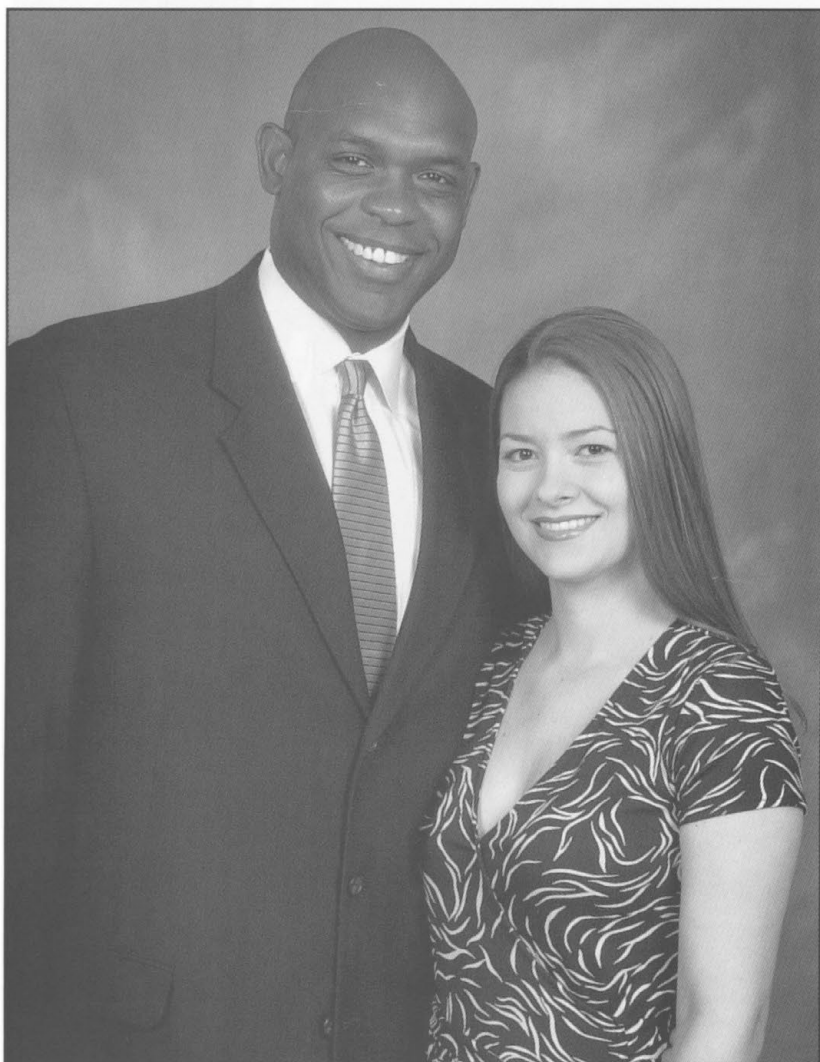
In 1989, LaFleur began his athletic administration career at LSU as Marketing and Promotions Coordinator. A year later, he was named Assistant Athletic Director to oversee 11 sports' budgets, scheduling and personnel.

A 1981 graduate of LSU, LaFleur was a standout football player for the Tigers, earning letters in 1977, 1979 and 1980 as a wide receiver and tight end. He spent six seasons in the NFL after being selected by the Philadelphia Eagles in the 1981 NFL Draft. LaFleur played with the St. Louis Cardinals from 1981-86 and with the Indianapolis Colts in 1986.

LaFleur was a graduate assistant with the LSU football program in 1987, helping the team to a 10-1 record and a fourth place national ranking.

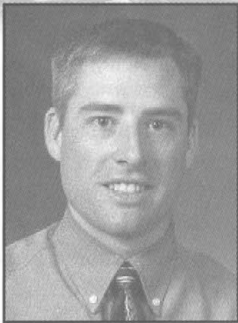
Active within the community and state, LaFleur had served on the Governor's Council on Physical Fitness and Sports. He was also a board member for the Special and Senior Olympics.

A native of Ville Platte, La., LaFleur and his wife, Corinne, were married in November of 2000.

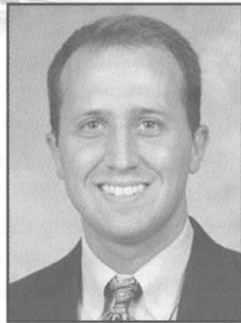

For the second year in a row, Southwest Texas finished with a 10-10 Southland Conference record and lost in the opening round of the SLC Classic.

As the Bobcats enter their third year under head coach Dennis Nutt, the focus is on the top spot in the Southland, a position familiar to Bobcat fans from title runs by the team in the 1990's.

Echoing his comments from a year ago, Nutt said "We have two goals at the beginning of each season: to win the Southland Conference and play in the NCAA Tournament."

Nutt brings back just two starters and only four letter winners from last year's squad, but feels confident the newcomers provide more depth, more versatility and more firepower.

"We return a core of four players who have gone through some Southland wars and who have been battle-tested," Nutt said. "They have been through the Southland race and know what it takes to succeed."

Despite coming off the bench for much of the season, Senior **David Sykes** (6-5) is the team's leading returning scorer and rebounder from a year ago and he will be counted on for leadership. While Sykes' scoring average was down last year, he became a more complete player leading the team in assists and finished first on the team and in the Southland with a school record 62 steals.

Senior's **Brady Richeson** (5-11) and **Moses Aguko** (6-8) are back for their final season as returning starters. Richeson is the team's designated long-range bomber, while Aguko found his role as a solid post-defender and rebounder and grew stronger in that role as the season progressed. The final returning letter winner is **Brad Brickens** (6-4), a sophomore who was a real crowd pleaser as a freshman point guard for the 'Cats.

The newcomers are headlined by transfer **Roosevelt Brown** (6-3), a junior guard with outstanding quickness, and **Terry Conerway** (6-3), another junior guard, who looks to be one of the prime scoring threats. **Nick Goellner** (6-10) is a likely candidate for extensive playing time, as is junior **Jeremiah Coleman** (6-7) a swing player with good size.

Noting the recent success of the program, Nutt's expectations this fall are for a return to the championship form.

"This program has enjoyed conference championships and a pair of NCAA appearances," Nutt said. "We expect that to return."

The Point Guards

With sophomore **Brad Brickens** back, SWT has a solid veteran at the position and added two newcomers in **Roosevelt Brown** (6-3, Jr.) and **Antwoine Blanchard** (5-11, Fr.) to the mix to make for a dynamic trio.

Brickens had some moments of pure highlight reel material last year and continues to work on his consistency for increased playing time.

The second member of the point guard position is **Blanchard**, who comes to SWT as a highly recruited prep player from Little Rock, Ark. An All-State player there, Blanchard is likely to find a way on the floor immediately.

Brown, a transfer from the University of Texas who sat out last year, will bring explosive athletic ability to both the point and off guard positions. His ability to defend will call for plenty of playing time.

"We have more depth and more experience at this position," Nutt said. "We also have plenty of versatility with so many able to play more than one spot on the perimeter."

"Brad has really grown as a point guard since last season, while Roosevelt can bounce around at each spot outside. Antwoine is another true point guard who has been solid this fall."

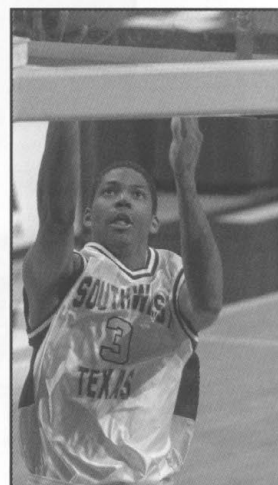
The Swingmen

The swingmen include players at the big or off guard and the small forward positions on the floor.

David Sykes (6-5), a Bobcat senior, heads the list as the team's leading returning scorer and rebounder at 9.4 points and 5.4 rebounds each night out. He was also the team leader in assists and steals (setting a school record).

Brady Richeson (5-11) is in his fourth year as a Bobcat and the senior has become one of the most dangerous outside shooters in the league. He will log in minutes at both the point and off-guard spots for SWT.

Newcomer **Terry Conerway** (6-3) is another member of the perimeter group. The transfer from Hill College is a scorer with the ability to put the ball on the floor and go to the basket.

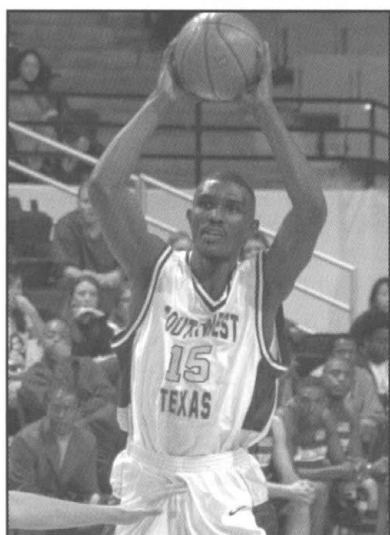

"David (Sykes) is the most experienced player in this group and has grown into a complete player for Southwest Texas," Nutt said. "He leads a group that is talented and athletic."

"Brady is a solid player for us with a tremendous shot and the ability to make shots in the clutch. Terry is a young man who has come in and had an outstanding fall of practice."

The Posts

One letter winner returns for the 'Cats at post, but four others, including three newcomers will give Southwest Texas depth, size and talent at the positions.

Senior **Moses Aguko** (6-8) is the team's warrior. Aguko came on during the second half of last season and was a consistent rebounder (5.0 rpg) and post defender for the Bobcats.

Jeremiah Coleman (6-7) is a newcomer from Midland Junior College who gives the 'Cats a high post threat to shoot or drive.

Brothers **Josh** and **Nick Goellner** are both new to Southwest Texas this fall. Josh (6-11) is a transfer from Abilene Christian who is a rugged rebounder, while younger brother Nick (6-10) is a freshman from Rockwall High who is a better scorer.

In addition, **John Martin** (7-0) returns for his second season on the squad. His off-season work and improvement should mean more playing time.

"Moses is a warrior," Nutt said. "He gives us someone who consistently goes out to play and does the little things it takes to win."

"Jeremiah is a tremendous athlete who can shoot from the high post. Josh is hard-nosed and battles under the boards, while Nick is a scoring

threat with excellent skills around the paint. John has made dramatic improvements and will see more playing time this season."

The Schedule

The 2002-03 schedule certainly has a nice balance to it with more home games than road games. The Bobcats host four non-conference opponents, while playing only three out of conference road games.

SWT opens at home on Nov. 26 against Mary Hardin-Baylor, then makes short trips to Texas Southern (Nov. 29) and Baylor (Dec. 4).

Back at home, the Bobcats play host to the University of Houston (Dec. 9), Hardin-Simmons (Dec. 14), and New Orleans (Dec. 17).

A trip to Fayetteville to take on the University of Arkansas for the second year in a row closes out the non-conference slate on Dec. 21.

In the midst of the holiday break, SWT will open Southland Conference play on the road, playing at McNeese State and Stephen F. Austin (Dec. 28 & 30).

The month of January includes four dates at home and four on the road, while February plays three at home and four away. The SLC schedule concludes at home in March with three regular season home games.

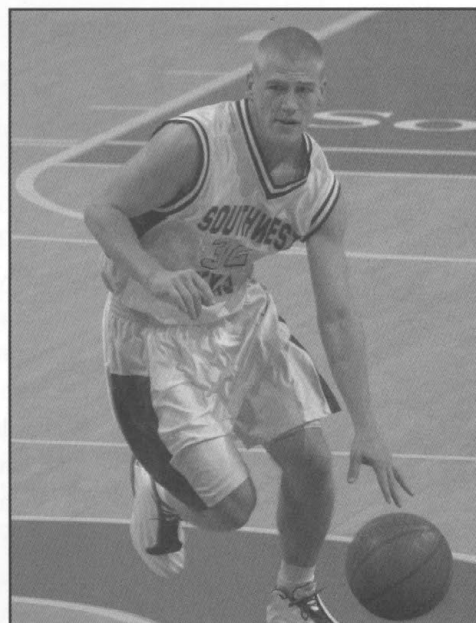
The post-season SLC Classic is slated for March 10-14 and will be played at campus sites for the second year in a row.

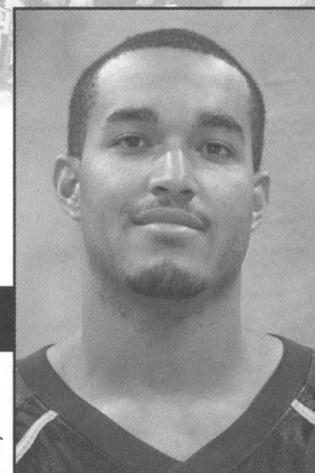

General: David Sykes enters his fourth and final season at Southwest Texas and is the team's leading returning scorer and rebounder.

2001-2002 (Junior): Sykes finished the year third on the team at 9.4 points per game and second in rebounding at 5.4 boards a game. He played in 26 of the team's 28 games, missing time with a dislocated finger. That finger lowered his shooting numbers on the year as he made just 39 percent of his field goal tries and 26 percent from beyond the arc. He was a 68 percent free throw shooter. Sykes' benefit to the team went far beyond scoring and rebounding, however, as he was the team's top playmaker with 102 assists and he broke the school record with 62 steals. Sykes finished first in the Southland Conference in steals and was fourth in the league in assists. Sykes led the team in scoring twice and he was the top rebounder on 11 occasions. His high-point game was a 24-point effort at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi. He added seven boards and seven assists in the Bobcat win. Sykes tallied double-digit scoring 13 times with two double-figure rebound games, 12 at UTSA in the SLC Classic and 10 at UTSA in the regular season.

2000-2001 (Sophomore): Sykes led the team and was 14th in the conference at 12.7 points per game and was voted to the All-Southland Conference Third-Team. Sykes played in all 28 games during the year, making 22 starts and averaging a team-high 31 minutes a contest. He was second on the team and 9th in the SLC with 6.6 rebounds a game and was second on the team and 10th in the Southland with 3.4 assists per game and was fifth in the league in assist to turnover ratio. Sykes shot 42.5 percent from the field and 28.4 percent from beyond the arc. He also made 68.5 percent of his free throws. Sykes was second on the team and 5th in the league in steals with 1.96 per game. He scored in double figures 20 times and led the team in scoring eight times. He tallied double-digit points in nine of his last ten and 14 of his final 16 games during the season. He led the team in rebounding eight times with a personal best of 10 boards in back-to-back

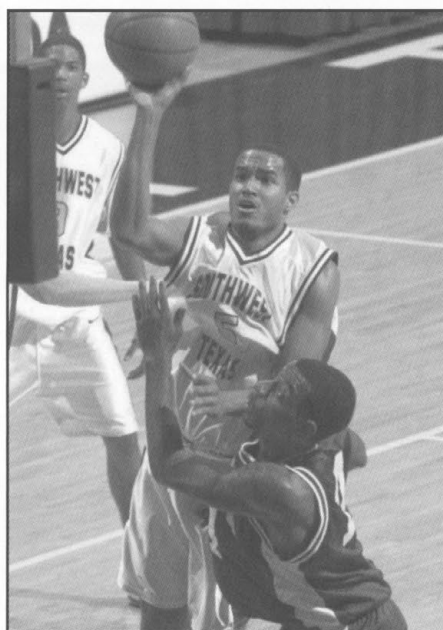
games against La.-Monroe and Northwestern State. His scoring best was a 28-point night on 11 of 19 shooting at home against UTSA. He had 28 points, eight rebounds, seven steals and four assists in the game. It was one of three 20-plus scoring efforts for Sykes. Twice he dished out a career-best eight assists.

1999-2000 (Freshman): Sykes played in all 29 games for the 'Cats in his first season on campus. He averaged 1.4 points and 1.4 rebounds a game, playing just over six minutes a contest. He made 28 percent of his shots from the field and 47 percent from the line. Sykes' scoring best was a nine-point evening at Texas-Arlington. He scored eight points against McNeese State and had seven points versus Colorado Christian. Sykes' rebounding high came in the UTA game with seven.

High School: Sykes earned three letters for Coach Phil McNeely at Duncanville, averaging 14.3 points, seven rebounds, eight assists and four steals a game in helping the team to a Texas Class 5A State Championship. He was a two-time First-Team All-District selection and was also named All-Region, All-Area and was an All-State selection as a senior. He was a McDonald's All-American nominee and was ranked in the top 50 players of Texas. Sykes was also a BCI All-American and was named Who's Who in Sports. As a junior, Sykes averaged 14.5 points and six rebounds a game, helping Duncanville to a 29-6 finish.

Personal:

Sykes was born May 27, 1981, in St. Louis, Missouri, and is majoring in exercise and sports science. His parents are David and Merna Sykes.



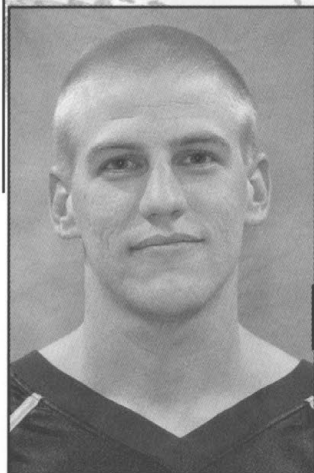

General: Brady Richeson returns to Southwest Texas for his senior campaign and will get playing time this season at both

the point and off-guard positions.

2001-2002 (Junior): Richeson played in all 28 games for the Bobcats last season, making 20 starts as he finished with a 7.0 points per game average. A long range shooting specialist, Richeson connected on 41.3 percent of his shots from the floor (57-138) and made 44.9 percent of his three-point tries (57-127). Oddly enough, all his made field goals were three-point shots, the only player in Division I to accomplish that feat. He finished second in the Southland in percentage and eighth in the SLC in three-point field goals made per game. Richeson also made 24 of 26 free throws or 92.3 percent. His high-game on the season was a 14-point effort against Northwestern State at home in Feb. He scored in double figures seven times, including six times in the last 11 games of the season. Richeson had a season-best three rebounds on five occasions and posted a career-best five assists at Lamar and at UTSA.

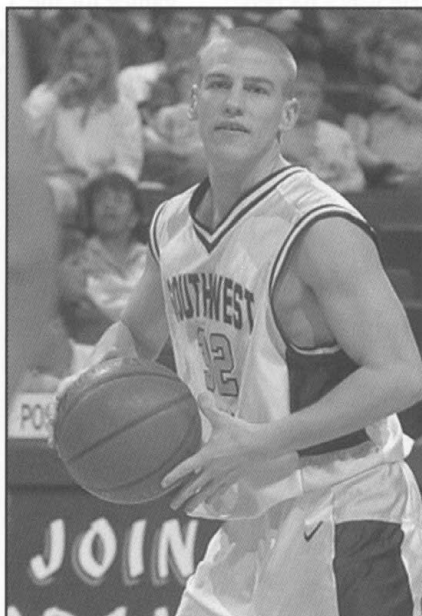
2000-2001 (Sophomore): Richeson played in 20 of the team's 28 games after missing the first eight. He averaged just over eight minutes a contest, working back into the guard rotation. Richeson averaged 2.5 points and less than one rebound a game for the 'Cats. He shot 34.8 percent from the field overall and made 35.1 percent of his three-point tries. He was successful on all four free throw attempts during the season. Richeson had his best night as a Bobcat when he tallied 14 points, pulled down two rebounds and dished out three assists in the SLC Classic game at UTSA. He made four of seven three-pointers and both free throws, scoring the 14 points in just 16 minutes.

1999-2000 (Freshman): Richeson played in all 29 games as a first-year Bobcat, earning one start in the Wisconsin-Green Bay contest. He averaged 4.5 points and one rebound a game, while shooting 41 percent from the field and 41 percent

from beyond the arc. He made three of seven free throw tries. Richeson was sixth in the Southland Conference in three-point shooting. Richeson's top scoring effort was an 11-point game against Texas-San Antonio. He made four of seven shots from the field, including three of six treys on the night. Richeson also had four nine-point scoring nights versus Southeastern La., Texas-Arlington, Nicholls State and Louisiana-Monroe. He pulled down three rebounds on five different occasions.

Richeson made at least one three-point shot in 20 of the 29 games during the season.

High School: Richeson helped Mountainview High to back-to-back Arizona State basketball championships. He averaged 13 points, seven assists and two steals a game as a senior in winning the second state title. Richeson played under Coach Gary Ernst, earning honorable mention All-State honors his final season. He completed his career with school records for most assists in a season and a career, most three-point field goals in a career and best free throw percentage over a career. As a junior, he averaged 10 points and 8.8 assists a game as Mountainview finished 34-1 and won the first Arizona State Championship. Starting as a sophomore, Richeson helped Mountainview to a 28-1 record. Richeson was a two-time All-District pick. He played on the same AAU team as former Bobcats Jason Blair and Ross Johnson.



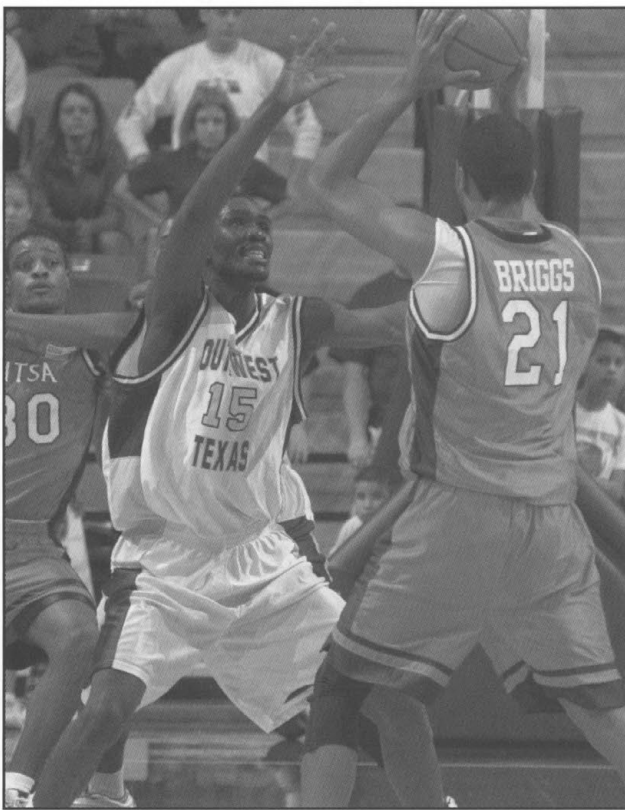
Junior College: Aguko played for Coach Chris Beard at Seminole as a sophomore, averaging 11 points and 10 rebounds a game.

2001-2002 REVIEW

SWT's All-SLC Pick – Clay Click

SWT's leading scorer, senior **Clay Click** was named to the All-Southland Conference Third-Team. Click, who missed two games with a lower back strain in Jan., led the team in scoring 17 times with 23 double-figure scoring nights. He was first in the SLC in FT% and three-point field goals and third in 3-PT%. Click posted his best night as a Bobcat in SWT's three-point loss at TCU. The 26-point scoring effort eclipsed Click's previous best of 22 points. It came with the help of eight made treys, tying a school record. In addition, Click now holds the single season records for three-point shots made (83) and attempted (198), records held by Maxwell Curry in 1990.

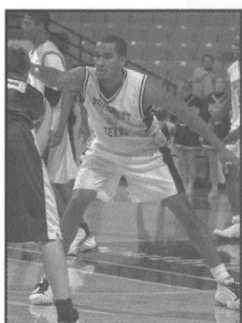


Clay Click established new records for three-point shots made and attempted.

Consistency

SWT has made at least one three-point field goal in 68 straight games. That includes all 28 from 2001-02, 28 from 2000-01, and the final 12 games of 1999-2000. **Clay Click** made at least one three in every game but one last year.

Bobcat Thieves



SWT broke the single season record for steals with 254 steals in 28 games in 2001-02. SWT had a school-record 20 in the win over UTSA to end the regular season. SWT was led by **David Sykes** with 62 (a new individual record) and **Marcus Johnson** with 47. The 'Cats ranked first in the SLC in steals. The old team record for steals in a season was 243 (1990-91).

At the Line

SWT's free throw shooting had its ups and downs in 2001-02 but was moving in the right direction at the season's end. SWT made 66.9 percent as a team. **Clay Click** picked up where he left off a year ago, finishing first in the SLC with a 88.5 percent mark. **Marcus Johnson** was 10th at 72% and **David Sykes** was 13th at 68%. SWT was fourth as a team in FT shooting.

Another Dancer?

It's been nearly five years since Strahan Coliseum said goodbye to "Wild Bill" and his entertaining dancing style during timeouts. It does appear, however, that the 'Cats have found a replacement in youngster **Dillon Villegas** who captivated crowds during the 2001-02 season.



The Century Mark

SWT hit the 100-point or century mark twice during the 2001-02 season. The first was a 108-71 opening night victory over Schreiner. The second time came in the 100-84 victory over Texas-Arlington. That was, however, the first time the 'Cats had reached 100 points in a Southland Conference game since 1999, when SWT won at UTSA, 100-86.

Record Night

Southwest Texas posted a Strahan Coliseum record and tied a school record with 47 made field goals in the season-opening 108-71 win over Schreiner. The 47 made field goals shatters the old coliseum mark of 40 set against Texas Lutheran (1999), and it ties the school mark of 47 that has occurred on four other occasions.

Another Record Falls

For the second time this season, the Bobcats made a change in the record book. This time, it was the 16 three-point field goals made at TCU that shattered the old school record of 14 set in 1990 vs. Sam Houston. Clay Click's eight treys tied the single game SWT mark.

'Cats Bid Farewell To Seniors

Southwest Texas said goodbye to six seniors in the final game of 2001-02. **Clay Click**, **Dain Ervin**, **Byron Hobbs**, **Gerald Scott**, **Slaven Smiljanic** and **Melih Yavsaner** ended their Bobcats careers last season.

THE SOUTHLAND CONFERENCE

In the fall of 2002, after six years as two separate entities, the Southland Football League and Southland Conference reunite under one banner. Regular-season and/or league championships in nine women's and eight men's sports will be contested as Southland Conference competition.

After 32 years of existence as the Southland Conference, the Southland Football League began competition in 1996 as a result of the addition of Troy State to the six I-AA football-playing members of the Southland Conference. The following year, (1997), Jacksonville State began competing as a member of the SFL.

Now, with the withdrawal of Troy State (2001), combined with the impending departure of Jacksonville State (2003), Southland administrators have voted to reunite football with the other 16 sponsored sports programs of the Southland Conference.

More than 39 years ago, presidents from Abilene Christian College, Arkansas State College, Arlington State College, Lamar State College of Technology and Trinity University met at the Baker Hotel in Dallas and established the expanding athletics organization known as the Southland Conference.

Since that meeting on March 15, 1963, the Conference has undergone significant change. Including football-only member Jacksonville State, membership has now grown to more than twice its original number with an all-time high of 12 institutions.

Lamar University, one of the original five members before withdrawing in 1987, rejoined the Conference on July 1, 1998. Lamar's reinstatement came one year after Southeastern La. University brought the Alabama-Texas-Louisiana-based Conference enrollment to 10 universities.

Southeastern La. joined McNeese State University, Nicholls State University, Northwestern State University and the University of Louisiana at Monroe in representing the Bayou State. Lamar joined Sam Houston State University, Southwest Texas State University, Stephen F. Austin State University, the University of Texas at Arlington and the University of Texas at San Antonio in blanketing the eastern half of Texas.

Southland Conference football members have established rich traditions within their programs. All seven programs have participated in postseason competition, with five of the seven qualifying for the NCAA Division I-AA playoffs in the last decade. Also, the other two member institutions secured NCAA Division II national titles prior to moving up to the Division I level. Southwest Texas State won the title in 1981 and 1982 and Jacksonville State in 1992.

As recently as last year, the Southland advanced three teams (Sam Houston State, Northwestern State and McNeese State) to the 16-team NCAA I-AA playoffs. In fact, in two of the last four years, three teams from the Conference have advanced and multiple teams have gone on to the playoffs in nine of the last 11 years.

The Southland's history of sending student-athletes to the ranks of the National Football League deepened last spring as five players were taken in the 2002 NFL Draft while six others signed free agent contracts.

During the Conference's 38 years of competition, all of its institutions have enjoyed success in other sports as well. In 2000, Louisiana-Monroe, McNeese State and Southwest Texas represented the Southland in the NCAA baseball championship. ULM won two games while SWT posted a victory over top-seeded Baylor. The University of Texas at Arlington advanced in 2001, winning an NCAA Regional game over the University of Houston while Lamar advanced in 2002, winning one game.

In men's golf, the Lamar and Texas-Arlington teams, along with three more individuals, were invited to play in the NCAA Tournament. Those were record numbers for the league. The

Southland has sent multiple teams to the postseason in the past-as recently as 1998 when SLU and UTA participated-but 2002 tops all years by having three individuals included in the field.

The Southland Conference has repeatedly demonstrated dedication to both the athletic and academic success of its student-athletes. The Conference annually recognizes one male and one female "scholar-athlete" from each member institution. Also, student-athletes with grade point averages above 3.0 are honored on the Conference's All-Academic teams, which are recognized following each season. Finally, the Southland Conference provides postgraduate scholarships to the male and female senior student-athlete with the highest grade point average.

The Southland Conference provides thousands of male and female student-athletes the opportunity to compete in intercollegiate athletics in a manner compatible with member institutions' educational missions. The list of standout Southland student-athletes grows longer each year.

Texas-San Antonio's Tameka Roberts holds the national record in the 200 meters and is an eight-time All-American. Charles Austin, the 1996 Olympic Gold Medalist in the high jump, was a track athlete at Southwest Texas. Joe Dumars, a former McNeese State basketball student-athlete, is retired and now works in the front office of the Detroit Pistons.

Thousands of students from Southland Conference institutions, including many student-athletes, have established outstanding careers in fields other than athletics. The list is extensive as all 11 universities consistently produce exceptional graduates. Former Southland students who have enjoyed tremendous national success

include Lyndon B. Johnson, a Southwest Texas graduate and the only graduate of a Texas college to be elected President. Several Southland schools boast alumni in the President's Cabinet, U.S. Congress and Senate, as well as high-ranking officials in the U.S. Armed Forces. News anchor Dan Rather is a graduate of Sam Houston State, while ESPN and ABC Sports commentator Robin Roberts is a Southeastern La. graduate and Tank McNamara cartoonist Bill Hinds is a Stephen F. Austin graduate. Country music singing sensation Tim McGraw attended Louisiana-Monroe, and actor Lou Diamond Phillips graduated from Texas-Arlington.

In addition to providing continually-expanding opportunities for student-athletes, the Southland Conference and its member institutions are very involved in various community outreach programs. Many of these programs provide positive reinforcement to school-aged students in member institutions' communities who have excelled in academics, citizenship and leadership.

The Southland Conference has been active in the NCAA Youth Education Through Sports (YES) program. In conjunction with nine of its championships during the past four years, NCAA/SLC YES Clinics have been conducted. Thousands of area youth have received instruction from Southland student-athletes and coaches in the sports of tennis, baseball, softball and volleyball through the clinics, designed as outstanding community outreach opportunities.

The Southland produces titles in football, men's and women's basketball, volleyball, men's and women's cross country, men's and women's indoor and outdoor track and field, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, baseball and softball.

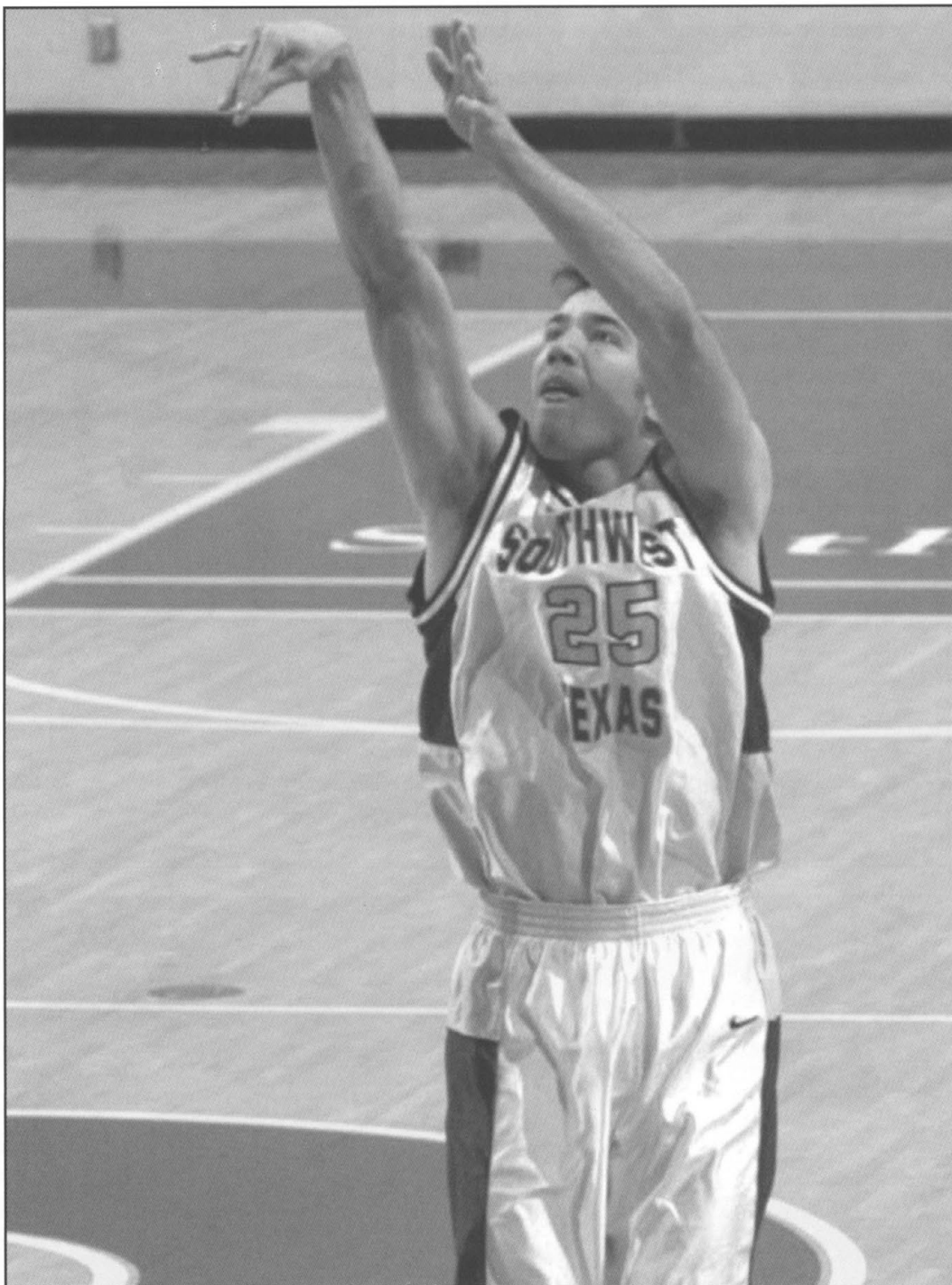

STRAHAN COLISEUM

► Four of the top ten all-time crowds have come in the last ten years.

► Southwest Texas witnessed its largest crowd ever in Strahan Coliseum with 5,591 fans at the SWT-UTSA game in 1998.

► Southwest Texas has a 90-35 home record over the past ten seasons.

Southwest Texas enters its 21st year in Strahan Coliseum, the \$8.8-million, 7,200-seat facility completed for use in 1982 for both the men's and women's basketball teams, as well as the volleyball team.

Strahan Coliseum gives SWT one of the finest playing facilities in the Southland Conference and in the Southwest. The Coliseum has a wood playing surface and all seats are individual, including 1,176 theater-styled padded seats.

The facility also houses four auxiliary gyms, a Maroon and Gold room for booster activities, and the central box office operations. The 126,000-square foot facility has lighting which meets television specifications and can be expanded to over 8,000 seats for concerts and other events.

Construction on Strahan Coliseum first started in November of 1979. It is adjacent to Jowers Center. The \$4.7-million Jowers Center houses many athletic offices, men's and women's dressing rooms, racquetball and handball courts, a gymnastics competition area, two gyms, weight rooms, training rooms, a student lounge, and laundry and equipment facilities.
